Fluvanna County Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Peter Gretz presented the FY24 Fluvanna County Public Schools Adopted Budget. Highlights of Dr. Gretz' presentation included:

## Accomplished in FY24 Budget

Compensation:

- Some salary scales and pay bands are not last compared to Albemarle, Charlottesville, Louisa and Goochland
- All positions receive at least a 7% and as much as a 13% increase
- Driver Hourly Rate for special trips to match regular rate (from \$15 to \$20/hour)
- Leverages all state funding toward salary
  - Including 1% retention bonus in Gov.'s proposal
- Absorbs health insurance increase

Student Mental Wellness and Behavioral Support

- Coordinator of Mental Health Services
- Moves 4 Behavioral Support Aides from (eliminated) Federal into Operating
- Assistant Principal at Central Elementary
- Instructional Assistant at Carysbrook Elementary (SPED numbers & severity of needs)

#### Efficiency

- Bring remaining 5 custodial contracts from 10 to 12 months
- Eliminate additional programs, supplies & supports provided through federal \$
- Eliminate hot spot devices and associated service used during pandemic

Virginia's Governor has signed a proclamation declaring Wednesday, February 15, 2023 as School Resource Officers (SRO) Appreciation Day in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

- We are always proud of the work and strong collaboration, Fluvanna County Public Schools (FCPS) and the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) have in our School-Law Enforcement Partnership for the SRO program.
- This announcement solidifies the support and future direction of this program.

Discovery Trail Meadow Prescribed Burn

- The next phase of Pleasant Grove Park's meadow prescribed burn will happen after February 19, 2023, in the Discovery Trail meadow when weather conditions are favorable. This area is located along Route 53 at the entrance to the Sheriff's Office and Library.
- Letters to land owners along Route 53 from D'Mary Store and Deli to Route 15 were mailed out February 13, 2023, and an in-person conversation was held with the landowner beside the meadow.
- The meadow area and trails leading to the meadow will be closed to the public for the day the burn happens. Access to the Sheriff's Office and Library should be not be affected.
- The meadows were prepped for the prescribed burn with bulldozing of the fire line on February 10, 2023. This involves removing the top layer of grass/brush/trees to dirt level about 3 feet from the outer edge of the meadows to contain the fire.
- Chuck Wright, Forester for the Virginia Department of Forestry, will be the lead Forester during the prescribed burn. He has submitted early burn exemption paperwork and it has been approved so the prescribed burn can legally happen before 4pm after February 15, 2023.

SUP 22:04 S.B. Cox Inc. – A Special Use Permit request in the I-2, General Industrial Zoning District to permit a (solid waste) materials recovery facility with respect to 90 +/- acres of Tax Map 4 Section A Parcel 27A. The subject property is located generally south of Richmond Road (US 250) and at the terminus of Memory Lane (SR 698) in the Rural Residential Planning Area and the Palmyra Election District.

#### Fluvanna County Required Screening

As specifically described within the Planning Staff Report and as specifically conditioned in this Special Use Permit request – Buffers, Mature Vegetation and Supplemental Evergreen Plantings will be required. As the Applicant has offered up and agreed to a one hundred (100) foot buffer to be completed on this subject property and that will include the entire perimeter of the 90 acre site and then specifically additional engineering site work will be completed by the Applicant on their sixteen (16) acre Materials Recovery Facility property for site operations.

VDOT Traffic Analysis – Access Management

• The Applicant's civil engineer, Labella Associates has worked with VDOT Louisa Residency Office Land Use Engineer during the Fall of 2022 through on-site visits to determine the required VDOT road improvements which are a part of SUP Application not Traffic Study document.



## 7 - ACTION MATTERS

*Kents Store Firehouse Remediation Contract* – Eric Dahl, County Administrator Timeline

- Wednesday, January 25<sup>th</sup>:
  - The Absolute Plumbing blackwater incident (water/sewage sludge) occurred a little after 3pm.
  - After the County was notified, the County notified Kents Store representatives around 3:30pm of the incident
  - In-person/telephone communication between the County, Kents Store/Fluvanna Fire and a remediation contractor occurred.
- Wednesday, January 25<sup>th</sup>:
  - Absolute Plumbing removed the sludge and the floors were mopped with an antibacterial cleaning solution several times, but more intensive microbial remediation and restoration is required.
  - H20 Disaster Services came out and sealed off the affected areas from firehouse bays, applied antimicrobial and set-up a large air filtration device.
- Thursday, January 26<sup>th</sup>:
  - The County arranged for an environmental assessment with TJL Environmental Health Consultants, Inc.
- Friday, January 27<sup>th</sup>:
  - TJL Environmental Health Consultants, Inc. performed the environmental assessment inspection
    The County arranged for a remediation and restoration company to quote the job on Monday,
  - January 30<sup>th</sup>, after the assessment report is received.
- Saturday, January 28<sup>th</sup>:
  - The County received the environmental assessment from TJL Environmental Health Consultants, Inc.
- Monday, January 30<sup>th</sup>:
  - Kents Store arranged for Ecosystems Environmental Services, Inc. to perform environmental assessment inspection.
- Tuesday, January 31<sup>st</sup>:
  - The County began working with Rainbow Restoration and H2O Disaster Services to provide a scope of work and bid the job.
- Wednesday, February 1<sup>st</sup>:
  - The County received the second environmental assessment from Ecosystems Environmental Services, Inc.
- Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>:
  - The County sent both assessment reports to both Rainbow Restoration and H2O Disaster Services to quote the job, and to the extent the reports conflict or call for a different scope for a particular issue, provide a quote to the report which requires more robust cleaning or more robust remediation control.
  - Spoke to Absolute Plumbing's owner about the incident and he indicated taking "full responsibility."
- Friday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>:
  - Spoke to Cincinnati Insurance on Absolute Plumbing's insurance claim
  - The County received a complete proposal back from Rainbow Restoration
  - The H20 Owner was out of the area and could not provide a proposal until Monday, February 6<sup>th</sup>.
  - The County engaged and signed a contract for remediation work with Rainbow Restoration around 6:30pm, with remediation work beginning Monday, February 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Monday, February 6<sup>th</sup>:
  - Rainbow Restoration began remediation work
  - Spoke to Absolute Plumbing's owner again about the incident, status and he again indicated taking "full responsibility."

Pleasant Grove Park Projects Update – Aaron Spitzer, Director of Parks and Recreation

#### Fence and Gate Project:

This presentation is to inform the BOS of a fence and gate installation near the front of Pleasant Grove Park. The fence and gate will be able to block the gravel portions of Pleasant Grove Drive and Lippard Lane in the park. Sheriff Hess supports this project as it will help with patrolling the park after it closes at dusk. Sheriff Hess also said that the Sheriff's Office will close the gates at dusk and open them at dawn.

#### Eagle Scouts Projects:

Parks and Recreation is working with multiple Boy Scouts to become Eagle Scouts through various other projects currently happening at the park. We are partnering to complete a 20' x 20' stage in front of the house, replacing a broken fence between the house and the pole barn, and replacing a kiosk near the soccer parking area where we had to move a trail entrance due to constant wet ground.

PG Park Additional Bathroom Facilities:

There have been citizen suggestions to have a working bathroom near the soccer field area. Public Utilities with Parks and Recreation has started the process to investigate what it will take to get such facilities in that area. We believe that an Engineer Study needs to be done first before moving forward.

# **10 - UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

Fluvanna County Community Center Renovation Update – Eric Dahl, County Administrator

The Board requested staff to bring forward a list of renovations for the Fluvanna Community Center. The list of requested renovation items can be seen in the FY24 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) request for the Fluvanna Community Center. Of the \$650,000 CIP request, Mr. Dahl proposed a portion of the items as part of the recommended FY24 CIP. Below shows what items have been recommended in FY24 (or sooner if the Board chooses) and what items were recommend to be deferred until FY25.

- 1. Patch and paint interior walls, doors, hard ceilings, exterior doors, windows, etc. \$50K.
- 2. Install carpet in the auditorium and entrance area \$30K.
- 3. Renovate bathrooms with new fixtures, stalls and vanities \$80K.
- 4. Install new roof \$250K.
- 5. Install sound system for auditorium \$20K.
- 6. Replace end of life span HVAC heat pumps \$90k.
- 7. Install concrete sidewalk to connect all the way around building \$80k.
- 8. Have HVAC engineer evaluate noise reduction options for auditorium area \$10K.
- 9. Install new flooring in building hallway \$30K.
- **10.** Have contractor/engineer investigate and provide solution to leaking basement \$10K.
  - FY24 (or sooner) Project Costs: \$150,000
  - FY25 (or sooner) Project Costs: \$500,000
- The Board agreed to discuss the improvements during the budget cycle.
