PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

ORDER

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to maintain order and decorum at meetings. The Chairman shall speak to points of order in preference to all other members.
- 2. In maintaining decorum and propriety of conduct, the Chairman shall not be challenged and no debate shall be allowed until after the Chairman declares that order has been restored. In the event the Board wishes to debate the matter of the disorder or the bringing of order; the regular business may be suspended by vote of the Board to discuss the matter.
- 3. No member or citizen shall be allowed to use abusive language, excessive noise, or in any way incite persons to use such tactics. The Chairman and/or the County Administrator shall be the judge of such breaches, however, the Board may vote to overrule both.
- 4. When a person engages in such breaches, the Chairman shall order the person's removal from the building, or may order the person to stand silent, or may, if necessary, order the person removed from the County property.

PUBLIC HEARING RULES OF PROCEDURE

1. PURPOSE

- The purpose of a public hearing is to receive testimony from the public on certain resolutions, ordinances or amendments prior to taking action.
- A hearing is not a dialogue or debate. Its express purpose is to receive additional facts, comments and opinion on subject items.
- 2. SPEAKERS
 - Speakers should approach the lectern so they may be visible and audible to the Board.
 - Each speaker should clearly state his/her name and address.
 - All comments should be directed to the Board.
 - All questions should be directed to the Chairman. Members of the Board are not expected to respond to questions, and response to questions shall be made at the Chairman's discretion.
 - Speakers are encouraged to contact staff regarding unresolved concerns or to receive additional information.
 - Speakers with questions are encouraged to call County staff prior to the public hearing.
 - Speakers should be brief and avoid repetition of previously presented comments.
- 3. ACTION
 - At the conclusion of the public hearing on each item, the Chairman will close the public hearing.
 - The Board will proceed with its deliberation and will act on or formally postpone action on such item prior to proceeding to other agenda items.
 - Further public comment after the public hearing has been closed generally will not be permitted.

VII. Uses of Equitably Shared Property

According to §19.2-386.14 (D) of the *Code of Virginia*, "all forfeited property, including its proceeds or cash equivalent, received by a participating state or local agency pursuant to this section shall be used to promote law enforcement but shall not be used to supplant existing programs or funds. For the sake of consistency, Virginia has chosen to adopt certain aspects of the federal guidelines.

A. General Guidance Concerning Use

- Equitably Shared Property Should Not be Anticipated Do not "spend it before you get it" or anticipate receipts.
 - a. the completion of the forfeiture is uncertain
 - b. the amount of the sharing that will ultimately be approved is also uncertain;
 - c. net proceeds have not been determined
- 2. Increase and Not Replace (Supplement vs. Supplant) Sharing must be used to increase or supplement the resources of the receiving state or local law enforcement agency. Shared resources shall not be used to replace or supplant the resources of the recipient. In determining whether the sharing increased or supplemented the receiving agency, the total law enforcement budget will be considered as opposed to any particular item or items within the budget. In other words, the receiving law enforcement agency's aggregate budget must benefit directly from the sharing. If for example, a police department receives \$100,000 in equitable sharing, only to have its budget cut \$100,000 by the city council, the police department has received no direct benefit whatsoever. Rather, the city as a whole has received the benefit of the equitable sharing.
- 3. Use of Interest Income Interest on forfeited cash or proceeds is subject to the same restrictions as the shared cash or proceeds.
- Prohibited Sharing Forfeited firearms may not be shared with foreign countries, state or local enforcement agencies. The Police Department who will take custody of forfeited firearms should be named in the Order of Forfeiture.

B. Uses of Shared Cash or Proceeds of Forfeited Property

- Permissible Uses: Subject to laws, rules, regulations, and orders of the state or local jurisdiction governing the
 use of public funds available for law enforcement purposes, the following expenses are pre-approved as
 permissible uses of shared funds and property.
 - a. Activities Calculated to Enhance Future Investigations The support of investigations and operations that may result in further seizures and forfeitures, e.g., payments to informants; "buy", "flash", or reward money; and the purchase of evidence.
 - b. Law Enforcement Training The training of investigators, prosecutors, and law enforcement support personnel in any area that is necessary to perform official law enforcement duties. Some examples of such training are the following: (1) asset forfeiture in general (statutory requirements, policies, procedures, case law); (2) the Fourth Amendment (search and seizure, probable cause, drafting affidavits, confidential informant reliability); (3) ethics and the National Code of Professional Conduct

for Asset Forfeiture; (4) due process rights; (5) protecting the rights of innocent third-parties (individuals and lienholders); (6) use of computers or other equipment used in or in support of law enforcement duties. The payment of college tuition, hospitality suites at conferences and other indirect training expenses are not allowed.

- c. Law Enforcement Equipment and Operations The purchase of body armor, firearms, radios, cellular telephones, computer equipment, software to be used in support of law enforcement purposes, vehicles (e.g., patrol vehicles, surveillance vehicles), electronic surveillance equipment, uniforms, travel, transportation, supplies, leasing of office and other space for task force and undercover operations, and leasing or purchase of other types of equipment that support law enforcement activities. Forensic labs and equipment and related training and certification expenses are permissible.
- d. **Detention Facilities** The costs associated with construction, expansion, improvement, or operation of detention facilities managed by the recipient agency.
- e. Law Enforcement Facilities and Equipment The costs associated with basic and necessary facilities, their construction, updating, remodeling, furniture, safes, file cabinets, telecommunications equipment, etc., that are necessary to perform official law enforcement duties.
- f. **Drug Education and Awareness Programs** The costs associated with conducting drug education and awareness programs by law enforcement agencies.
- g. Pro Rata Funding The costs associated with supporting multi-agency items or facilities. Example: A town purchases a new computerized payroll system; the police department payroll represents twenty percent of the total use of the payroll system. The police department may use shared money to fund its pro rata share (twenty percent) of the operating and maintenance expenses of the system.
- Asset Accounting and Tracking The costs associated with the accounting, auditing, and tracking of revenues and expenditures of equitable shared cash, proceeds, and tangible property.
- i. Salaries Many of the costs of the activities described above could entail the payment of salaries of the personnel involved. Due to the extreme sensitivity of asset forfeiture work, the payment of salaries of sworn law enforcement officers is limited to the following categories:
 - Overtime.
 - The first year's salaries only for new law enforcement officers that supplement the workforce.
 - Contractual appointments that do not exceed one year.
 - Salaries of officers assigned to non-traditional positions in approved specialized programs, which do not generally involve traditional law enforcement functions such as DARE officers.
 - Payments expressly authorized by law, such as the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS)
 program established by the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, which
 expressly permits state and local law enforcement agencies to use equitably shared asset forfeiture
 funds to meet the local match requirements of that program.

SUMMARY

The Facilities Maintenance Specialist-Technician maintains County facilities systems in a complete and thorough journeyman-like manner. Uses proper procedures, tools and equipment to perform maintenance and repair of architectural, plumbing, electrical, mechanical, and structural components and systems as assigned to maintain facility functions and environment. Duties may involve, but are not limited to:

- Perform routine maintenance, preventive maintenance, and repairs to buildings, equipment, and systems.
- Repair walls, ceilings, floors, stairs, windows, or doors.
- Repair or replace lights, plumbing fixtures, receptacles, or hardware.
- Diagnose maintenance problems and recommend how to correct them, checking blueprints, repair manuals, or parts catalogs, as necessary.
- Repair machines, equipment, or structures using tools such as hammers, hoists, saws, drills, wrenches, or equipment such as precision measuring instruments or electrical or electronic testing devices.
- Work is performed under minimal supervision.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

The Facilities Maintenance Specialist performs maintenance and repairs to County buildings, structures, equipment, and systems. (These are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work performed. The omission of specific duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position.)

- Demonstrates and applies knowledge of methods and general procedures in <u>at least two</u> <u>specialized areas of multiple</u>-building maintenance/construction trades and/or equipment service/repair_trades.
- Performs or assists in performing building maintenance and repair tasks such as carpentry, plumbing, masonry, electrical, HVAC, roofing, flooring, and painting.
- Duties and tasks are varied and <u>are range from</u>-moderately to considerably complex.
- Applies advanced skills in at least one area of specialization.
- Demonstrates proficiency with hand and power tools.
- Applies skill in use of required measuring devices and related mathematics.

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• Adapts procedures and, techniques, tools, materials, and/or equipment to meet special needs.

- Identifies and procures parts and materials.
- Demonstrates basic computer competency including email, web browser, and word processing.
- · Anticipates and solves problems on the job.
- Demonstrates ability to assess an assigned <u>tasks(s)</u>, <u>develop a plan of work</u>, <u>situation and</u> <u>determine scope and work to be done</u>, and <u>to</u>-follow <u>it</u> through to completion.
- Works independently and as part of a team; provides guidance while working with a team and can function as crew leader.
- Completes special projects as assigned.
- Performs assignments related to special event setups, completes special projects as assigned.
- · Performs snow removal and ice control, assists as directed in emergencies.
- Performs and assists in performing building maintenance and repair tasks such as carpentry, plumbing, masonry, electrical, HVAC, roofing, flooring, and painting.
- Assists and substitutes for custodial and grounds maintenance staff as needed.
- Complete<u>s</u> training as assigned.
- Other duties as assigned.
- Essential status.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Ability to learn.
- -----Knowledge of machines and tools, including their designs, uses, repair and maintenance.

Dear Mr. Nichols and Mr. Mahone:

This letter (the "Agreement") outlines the related matters with respect to Raymond James & Associates Inc.'s ("Raymond James") acting in the role of bidding agent (the "Bidding Agent") by and through Raymond James' Public Finance Investment Strategies Group ("PFISG") which is a department of Raymond James, for Fluvanna County (the "County") and the Virginia Public School Authority (the "Authority"). The Authority is acting at the request and for the benefit of the County. As used herein Bidding Agent shall mean Raymond James when acting as a bidding agent as described herein.

Under that Advisory Services Contract dated the 9th day of September, 2016 between the County and Raymond James, Raymond James is the County's municipal advisor and financial advisor and provides Services as the same is defined therein (the "Advisory Services Contract"). Raymond James acting as Bidding Agent hereunder is a transaction related Service contemplated under the Advisory Services Contract and this Agreement is an addendum to the Advisory Services Contract and shall be the written correspondence contemplated under Article III, Section (b) "Transaction Related Services (i.e. Bonds and Notes)" of the Advisory Services Contract. Raymond James acting as Bidding Agent does not eliminate any requirements Raymond James has under the Advisory Services Contract and is a transaction related service in addition to all those Services provided under the Advisory Services Contract. Raymond James represents and warrants that its acting as Bidding Agent does not conflict or otherwise limit its abilities to provide Services under the Advisory Services Contract and that all services it renders as Bidding Agent shall be consistent with the requirements of the Advisory Services Contract. The Agreement is an addendum to the Advisory Services Contract and shall be interpreted under the provisions of such Advisory Services Contract.

This "Agreement" pertains to our provision of potential future Bidding Agent Services relating to the competitive procurement of an escrow float contract (the "Contract") based upon the cash flow from defeasance obligations originally purchased with proceeds of the Authority's Series 2012 D Bonds to fund the escrow (the "Series 2012D Escrow Fund") for the Authority's Series 2008 Bonds under the Escrow Deposit Agreement dated December 20, 2012 (the "Series 2012D Escrow Deposit Agreement"), by and among the Authority, the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County, and Regions Bank, as escrow agent (the "Escrow Agent"). The Bidding Agent will solicit pre-approved counterparties (each a "Counterparty") to enable the Authority and the County to select the Counterparty that will pay the highest up-front payment ("Float Payment") to the Escrow Agent (as defined herein)

in exchange for the right of the Counterparty to exchange all or part of the Series 2012D Escrow Fund's cash flows commencing respectively on 8/15/2018 and 9/16/2018 (collectively referenced as the "Float") for U.S. Treasury Bills and other permitted defeasance obligations approved by the Authority, County, and the County's Bond Counsel that will mature on or before 12/1/2018 (the "Eligible Investments"). All parties hereto understand, agree and acknowledge: (i) that any Bidding Agent Services contemplated hereby are wholly conditioned on approval of the underlying transaction for the competitive procurement of an escrow float contract as described *supra* by the County and the Authority; (ii) that nothing herein obligates the Authority or County to enter into a Contract; (iii) that the County's Bond Counsel has not yet reviewed this Agreement or the underlying transaction for the competitive procurement of an escrow Agent only and Escrow Agent is subject to change at the sole discretion of the County and the Authority; (v) that nothing herein of the County and the Authority; (v) that this Agreement is an addendum to and a part of that Advisory Services Contract. All references to approval of any documents or actions by the Authority or the County includes approval by Bond Counsel and Counsel to the Authority and the County, respectively.

If the Contract closes, then the Authority and the County will authorize the Escrow Agent to exchange cash from the Series 2012D Escrow Fund on 8/15/2018 and 9/16/2018 or any date thereafter, as directed by the Counter-party per the Contract, for Eligible Investments delivered by the Counter-party which will have a principal amount equal to the reinvested portion of the Float and a maturity date no later than 12/1/2018.

The Counterparty will be permitted to deliver only Eligible Investments to the Escrow Agent.

The scope of services within this engagement includes the following:

- 1. Review, discuss, and analyze the Series 2012D Escrow Fund's float periods;
- 2. Provide estimates of the market value of the potential Float Payment from potential counterparties;
- 3. Develop bid specifications for the Contract designed to meet the anticipated Series 2012D Escrow Fund disbursement requirements and the conditions of the Series 2012D Escrow Deposit Agreement as directed by the Authority and the County;
- 4. Pre-market bid and act as liaison between potential counterparties and the Authority and the County prior to the bid;
- 5. Provide market color to the working group as to the expected Float Payment;
- 6. Conduct the bid process (receiving bids from as many potential counterparties as possible) and report results to the Authority and the County and any other relevant party(ies);
- 7. Manage the settlement process to closure by requiring appropriate focus by the working group, and of course, and most importantly, the winning Counterparty on satisfying the conditions of the Bid Specifications and the Series 2012D Escrow Deposit Agreement; and
- 8. Provide documentation with regard to any such bid process to the Authority and the County (and any other parties).

In consideration for Raymond James acting as Bidding Agent, the winning Counterparty will pay to us on the Authority's and the County's behalf a flat fee of \$25,000 with respect to the Contract upon closing. In addition, the winning Counterparty will pay to us on the Authority's and the County's behalf a verification agent fee in an amount not to exceed \$3,500. In all, the winning Counterparty will pay to us on the Authority's and the County's behalf a verification agent fee in an amount not to exceed \$3,500 and no less than \$25,000. Such fees will be specifically delineated within the Bid Specifications sent to any and all potential counterparties and will be paid on the Authority's and the County's behalf directly to the Bidding Agent by the winning Counterparty. The winning Counterparty's payment of this fee means the Float Payment the Authority and the County will receive is lower than it would have been without the fee. After the award, we can provide comment on the Contract and facilitate the flow of information, but we are not acting as the Authority or the County's legal advisor with regard to finalizing the details of the Contract. Payment by the winning provider of the fee to Raymond James will be contingent upon successful closing of the Contract. Should the

Authority, acting at the direction of the County, not authorize the Bidding Agent to disseminate a term sheet or ever get to the point where Bid Specifications are disseminated or for any other reason it elects to not proceed once work has begun, neither the County nor the Authority will owe a fee to Raymond James. Further, should a Contract not be executed or should a Contract not close for any reason or no reason at all, then no fees, amounts or costs of any kind shall be owed to Raymond James/Bidding Agent.

All parties acknowledge and are hereby deemed to agree that Bidding Agent is acting as a bidding agent with respect to the Contract. Bidding Agent's engagement includes solicitation of bids with respect to the Contract. Raymond James as a part of the Services under the Advisory Services Contract is engaged to compare alternatives to the Contract. By reason of this Agreement Bidding Agent will not be assumed to be a party to, nor liable under, any contract, agreement or understanding executed or otherwise existing to affect the Contract; except that Raymond James/Bidding Agent is a party to and liable under any such contract, agreement or understanding executed or otherwise existing if (i) such is required, contemplated or provided for by the Advisory Services Contract; or (ii) if Raymond James and/or Bidding Agent is a signatory to the same. Bidding Agent will not: (i) provide any assurances that every possible potential counterparty has been solicited; (ii) investigate the veracity of any certifications provided by any party; (iii) provide opinions that the bidding procedures comply with any applicable law; or (iv) be liable to any party if any investment fails to close or for default of any investment. Raymond James services as Bidding Agent terminate on the settlement date of the Contract and Raymond James shall have no further duties or obligations as Bidding Agent for the County under the Advisory Services Contract and nothing herein is intended to modify, alter or eliminate any existing Services thereunder.

The Authority and the County acknowledge and agree that Bidding Agent has been retained to act solely as Bidding Agent for the Authority and the County with respect to the Contract, and not as an agent or advisor to any other person, and the Authority's and County's engagement of Bidding Agent is not intended to confer rights upon any person (including employees or creditors of the Authority or the County) not a party hereto as against Bidding Agent or its affiliates, or their respective directors, officers, employees or agents, successors, or assigns. Bidding Agent shall act as an independent contractor under this Agreement, and not in any other capacity, and any duties arising out of its engagement shall be owed solely to the Authority and the County. The scope of the Bidding Agent's services is strictly limited to those outlined above and requested by the Authority and the County and this shall be in addition to all those Services provided by Raymond James to the County under that Advisory Services Contract.

The Bidding Agent agrees to assist the Authority and the County as provided only on the basis that it is expressly understood and agreed that the Bidding Agent, in its capacity as Bidding Agent, assumes no responsibility to the Authority or the County or any person for the accuracy or completeness of any information contained in any Preliminary Official Statement or Official Statement issued in connection with the Series 2012D Bonds except as such is required or provided for under the Advisory Services Contract.

The Bidding Agent or its affiliates may have business relationships with the provider or other providers of information relevant to the matter. These business and trading relationships include, but may not be limited to, trading lines, frequent purchases and sales of securities and other engagements through which Bidding Agent may have, among other things, an economic interest. Aside from described above, Bidding Agent will not receive compensation from any third party with respect to the purchase of the Contract. Bidding Agent is involved in a wide range of activities from which conflicting interests or duties may arise. Information which is held elsewhere within Bidding Agent, but of which none of the individuals involved in the Contract purchase actually has knowledge, will not for any purpose be taken into account in determining Bidding Agent's responsibilities to the Authority and the County.

This Agreement may be terminated by any party prior to the completion of services with prior written notice to the other parties. No party shall incur any liability to the other arising out of the termination of this Agreement.

This Agreement is an addendum to that Advisory Services Contract and this addendum embodies all the terms, agreements, conditions and rights contemplated and negotiated by the Authority and the County and the Bidding Agent, with respect to the Bidding Agent Services as a transaction related service under the Advisory Services Contract

and supersedes any and all discussions and understandings, written or oral, between Authority and the County and Bidding Agent regarding the Bidding Agent Services. Any modifications and/or amendments must be made in writing and signed by all parties. All of the provisions of the Advisory Services Contract are hereby ratified and remain in full force and effect.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia without reference to any conflicts of law provisions that apply the law of a different jurisdiction.

The Committee chose to move forward with Dowdy's Forest & Land Management, LLC, with any timber sales that Dowdy's facilitates earning Dowdy's an 8% commission. Individual Task order agreements will be brought to the board at a later date and will include actual Cost and/or Revenue projections.

Following a recap of the background and process the Board chose to defer the item, and to set-up a conference call with VPSA, Raymond James, Mrs. Eager, Mr. O'Brien, and staff to review the options.

Advertisement of the Proposed Fluvanna County Code Amendment Concerning Prohibition on Possession of Open or Opened Container(s) of Alcoholic Beverages in Designated Public Areas and on County Property, Subject to Exceptions—Fred Payne, County Attorney, brought forward a request to amend the County Code with regard to open containers of alcohol. Enabling legislation allows localities to prohibit the possession of open or opened containers of alcoholic beverages in designated public areas, including public parks, playgrounds, public streets, and on sidewalks adjoining public streets. The County also has the authority to prohibit the possession of open or opened containers of alcoholic beverages on County-owned property. This is subject to exceptions, including any time the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board has granted a license for the service and/or consumption of alcohol or where the County has granted permission for the service and/or consumption of alcohol on County-owned property, as is permitted in Section 14-4 of the Fluvanna County Code. This ordinance is intended as a supplement to the provisions of Section 14-4 of the Fluvanna County Code.

Advertisement of the Proposed Fluvanna County Code Amendment Concerning Designation of the Sheriff as a Person Lawfully in Charge of the Property for Purposes of Trespass—Fred Payne, County Attorney, brought forward a request to amend the County Code, allowing property owners to designate the Sheriff to act on their behalf regarding trespassing; enabling legislation allows localities to pass an ordinance such as this to provide additional protection to property owners. This ordinance allows property owners to specifically grant local law enforcement the authority to act as their agent to enforce trespassing laws without the property owner being present. This provision is commonly used in counties and cities in the Commonwealth. This provision is particularly helpful in the context of rental properties, commercial areas, or other property with absentee property owners. It can also help to protect owners of land who have frequent problems with trespassing and illegal dumping.

AYE: Sheridan, Booker, Eager, O'Brien, and Weaver. NAY: None. ABSENT: None.

PRESENTATIONS

JABA - Memory Clinic and Dementia Care Coordinator Program—George Worthington, JABA Supervisor for ADRC Development, came before the Board to present two different programs of JABA responding to the needs of patients recently diagnosed with cognitive deficits or dementia. Mr. Worthington provided a brief overview of these pilot programs, hosted by the University of Virginia Aging and the Memory Clinic.

TJPDC Local and Regional Projects Briefing – Chip Boyles, TJPDC Executive Director, presented an overview of the Local and Regional Projects being undertaken by TJPDC. TJPDC is in the process of developing its Annual Work Program for FY 2018, hoping to encourage input and participation from its member governments in the process. This year, in addition to regional efforts, TJPDC has developed a process that identifies an amount of time staff may spend directly on local projects for each of our member localities and, with participation from local officials and staff in identifying priority activities for your local government, TJPDC will be better able to assist the locality. Each member government would decide how best to identify local needs and to suggest regional topics for inclusion in the annual work program. During this process, TJPDC would also be available to discuss any individual local needs. Chair Sheridan asked about a planned Rivanna River Basin Commission kayak trip; Mr. Boyles indicated that the event is being rescheduled.

FLDP Presentation: Civil War Park Improvements—Burt Marks, 2017 FLDP Class Member, presented recommendations and suggestions for improvements to Civil War Park and the areas near and around the Historic Courthouse. These recommendations and suggestions were the result of a class project for the 2017 Fluvanna Leadership Development Program. Mr. Marks, on behalf of his class group, highlighted current characteristics of the park and near--surrounding areas that will prohibit the park from being compliant with ADA laws and requirements, as well as the inclusion of a monument to honor the Emancipation Proclamation.

Among the recommendations and suggestions:

- Improving access into and around the park;
- Improving lighting around the park and downtown Palmyra;
- · Placement of a monument in the park commemorating the Emancipation Proclamation.
- In addition, Mr. Marks petitioned the Board for \$1000; these funds would be used as seed money for fundraising the funds needed to upgrade park access;

At the conclusion of the presentation, Mr. Marks thanked the Board for their consideration.

FY17 3rd Quarter Budget Report—Martin Brookhart, Management Analyst, presented a brief summary of the FY17 Third Quarter Budget. There was minimal discussion following the report.

Following the FY17 3rd Quarter Budget Report, Mrs. Booker petitioned the Board to revisit the FLDP presentations, and thanked the class members for their work and suggestions. Mr. Nichols commented that this year's projects were exceptional and provided achievable results.

The original stone steps leading the front doors of the Courthouse have no railings; likewise, neither end of the front porch has a barrier to prohibit anyone from falling from the porch, a drop of approximately three feet. Mr. Stephens recommended placing period-appropriate wooden benches at either end. With regards to the steps, Mr. Stephens did not recommend placing a railing, rather, signage indicating and directing visitors to the handicapped accessible entrance on the side of the Courthouse. Following the presentation, the Board directed staff to work closely with the Fluvanna Historical Society to implement safety measures at the Historic Courthouse, including placement of signage and potential side benches for the front porch.

Emancipation Proclamation Monument Placement. Mrs. Booker reported on communications that she has initiated to request an opinion from the Virginia Attorney General regarding the placement of a monument to the Emancipation Proclamation in Civil War Park, Palmyra. Mrs. Booker indicated that she contacted Delegate Lee Ware regarding this issue. Delegate Ware contacted the Attorney General and indicated that he believed the request was not coming from the Board; however, upon further contact, Delegate Ware recommended that the County Administrator, on behalf of the Board, draft a letter of request, to Delegate Ware, who will then submit the request to the Attorney General.

ACTION MATTERS

FY17 CIP Fiber Network Project Supplemental Appropriations – Eric Dahl, DCA/Finance Director, Chuck Winkler, FCPS Superintendent, & Josh Gifford, FCPS IT Director, provided a comprehensive update of the combined Schools/County fiber project. Mr. Gifford outlined the process by which a provider was chosen, profiled the provider, Computer Cabling & Telephone Services, Inc., the scope of work (SOW), and proposed cost. Mr. Gifford also reviewed the E-Rate application and review process, noting that E-Rate offers an additional 10% match to any self-provisioned fiber applicant that uses State grants for 10% of the project.

Mr. Gifford highlighted the original estimated costs, and the updated costs with and without E-Rate funds:

Mr. Weaver raised concerns about the uncertain nature of E-Rate funding. Mr. Nichols indicated that E-Rate funds are not

guaranteed; however, the Board cannot approve the project after a determination of E-Rate approval has been made.

<u>Mr. O'Brien moved</u> the Board of Supervisors approve a supplemental appropriation of \$43,500 from Unassigned Fund Balance to the FY17 CIP for the County Fiber Network Project. <u>Mrs. Eager gave second</u> and the motion passed 4-0. AYE: Booker, Eager, O'Brien, & Weaver. NAY: None. ABSENT: Sheridan.

The foregoing actions shall be in addition to the \$430,222 previously appropriated for the project. The County may receive a possible E-Rate rebate of 60% of the School and Library costs portion of the project contract.

County Self-Provisioned Fiber Project Contract—Cyndi Toler, Purchasing Officer, requested approval of a contract between Computer Cabling & Telephone Services, Inc. Reiterating the information provided by Mr. Gifford in the previous action matter, Ms. Toler summarized the Invitation for Bid process, and noted the following: For the Schools project:

\$440,000 cost up front, with the likelihood of receiving \$352,000 back from the E-Rate reimbursements and VPSA matching funds.

For the County project:

• \$43,500 cost up front, with the likelihood of receiving \$6,600 back from the E-Rate reimbursement for the Library. With no questions or discussion,

MOTION

<u>Mrs. Eager moved</u> the Board of Supervisors approve the contract between the County of Fluvanna, Virginia, and Computer Cabling & Telephone Services, Inc., for self-provisioned fiber construction installed between county buildings in the amount of \$43,500.00 and further authorize the County Administrator to execute the agreement subject to approval as to form by the County Attorney. <u>Mr. O'Brien seconded</u> and the motion passed 4-0. AYE: Booker, Eager, O'Brien, & Weaver. NAY: None. ABSENT: Sheridan.

FY17 Supplemental Budget Appropriation for CSA Purchase of Services—Mary Anna Twisdale, CSA Coordinator, came forward with an overview of the CSA purpose and process, detailed current and historical expenditures, and outlined expected additional funding for FY17. Mrs. Twisdale noted that the CSA Purchase of Services budget is over-budget and projects the final FY17 amount to be approximately \$780,902. Local funds will account for approximately 38% of the total CSA Purchase of Services budget with the State pool covering the remaining 62%. This over-budget balance changes daily as children come into the program, and as unused funds are released for services. The current CSA Purchase of Services budget is \$2,700,000. This supplemental appropriation would make the revised budget \$3,480,902.

<u>Mrs. Eager moved</u> the Board of Supervisors approve a supplemental appropriation of \$780,902 for the FY17 CSA Purchase of Services Budget, with the local portion of funding of \$296,743 to come from Unassigned Fund Balance. <u>Mr. Weaver offered second</u> and the motion passed 4-0. Emergency Ordinance Revision - Central Absentee Precinct Location – Steve Nichols, County Administrator, requested to effect a temporary change in the location of the central absentee precinct from the Historic Courthouse to the Weaver Building during the Courthouse repairs. Because time does not permit the usual notice period for adoption before the primary election now set for June 13, 2017, this ordinance amendment is an emergency measure pursuant to Virginia Code Sec. 15.2-1427-F. This statute provides that any emergency ordinance can be enforced for not more than 60 days unless readopted with the usual formalities. However, in this case, there will be no need for such readoption, since the amendment provides for it to expire less than 60 days from its adoption.

The County Attorney, at the Registrar's request, discussed this with Mr. Braun of the State Board of Elections, and Mr. Braun was understood to say that he believed this procedure would resolve the issue satisfactorily.

The parcels and structures are all within the 100 year flood plain. Once acquisition is complete, the four structures will be demolished. This Task Order is required to allow for bidding services for water and sewer lines, an elevated water storage tank, a water booster station, & a sewage pump station. Bidding services outlined in Section 7 of the Fee Proposal includes the following:

• Prepare the complete bid package including all bid documents, plans, and specifications, have them approved by the OWNER, distribute them to the potential bidders, and maintain a list of the potential bidders. Dewberry may charge a reasonable, non-refundable fee to potential bidders for bid documents.

• The OWNER shall prepare the advertisement for construction bids, advertise the bid, and pay the advertising cost.

• Provide five (5) sets of bid documents for the OWNER's use.

• Attend and run a pre-bid conference and coordinate responses to questions from bidders.

• Dewberry shall prepare, the OWNER shall approve, and Dewberry shall be responsible for distribution of any addenda.

• Attend the bid opening, review the bids, and recommend to the OWNER award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder who complies with all Federal, State and Local regulations.

• The water booster station will be combined with the sewage pump station in one construction package. Bidding services for water booster station and sewage pump station construction package will be provided concurrently.
