PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

I pledge allegiance, to the flag, of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

GENERAL RULES OF ORDER

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to maintain order and decorum at meetings. The Chairman shall speak to points of order in preference to all other members.
- 2. In maintaining decorum and propriety of conduct, the Chairman shall not be challenged and no debate shall be allowed until after the Chairman declares that order has been restored. In the event the Board wishes to debate the matter of the disorder or the bringing of order; the regular business may be suspended by vote of the Board to discuss the matter.
- 3. No member or citizen shall be allowed to use defamatory or abusive language directed at any member of the Board or other person, to create excessive noise, or in any way incite persons to use such tactics. The Chair shall be the judge of such breaches, however, the Board may by majority vote of the Board members present and voting to overrule the judgment of the Chair.
- 4. When a person engages in such breaches, the Chairman shall order the person's removal from the building, or may order the person to stand silent, or may, if necessary, order the person removed from the County property.

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS

PURPOSE

- The purpose of a public hearing is to receive testimony from the public on certain resolutions, ordinances or amendments prior to taking action.
- A hearing is not a dialogue or debate. Its express purpose is to receive additional facts, comments and opinion on subject items.

2. SPEAKERS

- Speakers should approach the lectern so they may be visible and audible to the Board.
- Each speaker should clearly state his/her name and address.
- All comments should be directed to the Board.
- All questions should be directed to the Chairman. Members of the Board are not expected to respond to questions, and response to questions shall be made at the Chairman's discretion.
- Speakers are encouraged to contact staff regarding unresolved concerns or to receive additional information.
- Speakers with questions are encouraged to call County staff prior to the public hearing.
- Speakers should be brief and avoid repetition of previously presented comments.

3. ACTION

- At the conclusion of the public hearing on each item, the Chairman will close the public hearing.
- The Board will proceed with its deliberation and will act on or formally postpone action on such item prior to proceeding to other agenda items.
- Further public comment after the public hearing has been closed generally will not be permitted.

Requested Action: Request for a Special Use Permit to construct a 199' self-support

tower with an enclosed 80' x 90' fence, with respect to 12.7 acres

of Tax Map 39, Section A, Parcel 29. (Attachment A)

Location: The property is located off of West River Rd. (State Route 6),

approximately 0.6 miles northeast of the intersection with Rockfish Run Rd. (State Route 683). The property is located in the Fork Union Election District and is within the Rural Preservation

Planning Area. (Attachment B)

Existing Zoning: A-1, Agricultural General (Attachment C)

Existing Land Use: Vacant Land

Planning Area: Rural Preservation Planning Area

Adjacent Land Use: Adjacent properties are zoned A-1. One property that is nearly

adjacent is zoned I-2.

Zoning History: Previous SUP 12:07, approved 6-0-0 by Planning Commission on

October 24, 2012 subject to 15 conditions. Same SUP approved 4-0-0 by Board of Supervisors November 20, 2012 subject to 15

conditions.

Previous SUP 12:07

This was a request for a special use permit to construct a 199 foot monopole telecommunications facility and associated ground equipment with respect to 12.7 acres of Tax Map 39, Section A, Parcel 29. SUP 12:07 was approved 6-0-0 by the Planning Commission October 24, 2012 subject to 15 conditions. SUP 12:07 was approved 4-0-0 by the Board of Supervisors on November 20, 2012 subject to 15 conditions. SUP 12:07 expired on May 20, 2014.

The previous SUP was for a 199' tall monopole telecommunications facility and associated ground equipment. This SUP application (19:01) is for a 198' self-support tower with a one foot lightning rod, therefore making the tower 199'. The only distinction between the two towers is that the previously submitted tower was a monopole and this tower is a lattice. This tower will be used for commercial purposes and will be designed to accommodate a minimum of 4 carriers. A letter of intent to serve has already been submitted by AT&T.

Previous SUP 12:07 Conditions

From the Board of Supervisors staff report dated November 21, 2012:

"Please accept this letter as notification of the action taken on November 20, 2012 by the Board of Supervisors in regards to the request referenced above. This request was **approved 4-0** with the following 15 conditions:

- 1) The tower, including antennae, will not be higher than 199 ft. and will not be lit;
- 2) The applicant secures all necessary permits required, and submits structural design and certification by a Virginia Registered Professional Engineer that the proposed facility, as built, will comply with EIA/TIA 222-G for the wind zone for Fluvanna County; Virginia;
- 3) Prior to issuance of building permits the applicant shall submit satisfactory SHPO and NEPA documentation;
- 4) The applicant shall secure the necessary permits required by Fluvanna County and VDOT;
- 5) The applicant shall provide space on the TASF for the County's Public Safety antennas and feed lines at the highest designed elevation. Space for ground level electronic equipment shall also be provided;
- 6) The facility when completed shall be accessible only to authorized personnel;
- 7) The tower shall be a monopole, and shall be engineered with breakpoint technology;
- 8) The facility shall install the necessary landscaping buffer;
- 9) The applicant shall install an emergency generator to ensure continuity of telecommunications operations in the event of a disaster or major power outage; and provisions for such generators shall include additional special treatments; for diesel, a fuel retaining area for propane, ignition separation requirements; and that generator testing shall occur only between 9 AM and 4 PM Monday through Friday; and the same shall be noted on the site development plan;
- 10) If the structures should no longer be needed, the applicant shall remove them, and restore the grounds to the prior condition;
- 11) The support structure is to be sufficient to support antennas of a like design for at least six (6) wireless service providers in accordance with Sec. 22-27-5 of the County Code;
- 12) The tower shall be constructed substantially as shown in the application;
- 13) Violation of any condition of this permit shall be grounds for revocation of this permit, and;

- 14) The Board of Supervisors, or their representative, has the right to inspect the property for compliance with these conditions at any time.
- 15) The facility shall be constructed and receive final inspection from the Fluvanna County Department of Building Inspections within eighteen (18) months of the date of approval of the special use permit."

Comprehensive Plan:

Land Use Chapter:

The Comprehensive Plan designates this property as within the Rural Preservation Planning Area. According to this chapter:

"Development in the rural preservation areas should consist of farmland, preservation zones, or otherwise environmentally sensitive land with scattered housing. Development in the rural preservation area should maximize open space. Open space should be clustered to maximize large areas of open space whenever possible. If possible, greenway trails may be integrated to link rural neighborhoods with surrounding neighborhoods and open spaces."

At the proposed location, only the tower will be seen, as both proposed tree landscaping/screening and the natural landscape of the site will block any view of the support buildings from the road. Additionally, the tower will be located approximately 700 feet from the Route 6 Right-of-Way, making it largely hidden from passing traffic.

Infrastructure:

Goal 5: To facilitate the deployment of comprehensive communications networks that ensures the reliability of the public safety, wireless, and broadband services.

According to the applicant, National Communication Towers LLC, AT&T has already submitted a letter of intent to serve on this tower which will provide phone coverage, high-speed internet service, and data transmissions to the surrounding areas. Additionally, this tower will be able to work in conjunction with both the existing VFW Tower and County Landfill Tower, therefore creating connectivity in service.

Analysis:

This is a special use permit application to allow for the construction of a 199' tall self-support telecommunications tower. This tower is in compliance with the Fluvanna County Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance. A tower of very similar dimensions was already approved on this same lot previously in 2012, but at that time there was no letter of intent from a carrier.

Staff conducted a site visit on Tuesday, February 26, 2019 in order to assess the potential visual impacts of the proposed tower and also to observe the balloon test. Weather conditions that day were sunny, dry, and cool with little wind. Staff concluded that the tower would be visible from portions of West River Road (Route 6), at the subject parcel, but only minimally visible when traveling east or west away from the subject parcel. The tower would also be visible from portions of the Rosewood Manor Rural Cluster subdivision located south of the site. However,

dense forest lines made it difficult to see the balloon from most areas of the subdivision. The balloon was clearly visible from Fluvanna Baptist Church and Parsonage that is located directly across Route 6 from the proposed site. (Attachment E)

First, the proposed use should not tend to change the character and established pattern of the area or community.

The proposed use of a tower on this site was approved in 2012 by the Board of Supervisors. This particular location, located back from the roads and placed in the woods, will block the view of the support facilities at the base of the tower through the combined concealment of landscaping and terrain. This is a low intensity use, and the surrounding area features a mix of residential and agricultural uses. This use was already approved for this site.

Second, the proposed use should be compatible with the uses permitted by-right in that zoning district and shall not adversely affect the use/or value of neighboring property.

This use was already approved for this site; there are no changes to the location of this tower. The proposed tower location will be such that support facilities cannot be seen from the road due to natural terrain and made-made landscaping. As previously mentioned, this will be a lattice tower as opposed to a monopole, but will still have all of the proper screening.

Neighborhood Meeting:

There were zero (0) attendees at the February 13, 2019 neighborhood meeting.

Technical Review Committee:

The following comments are the result of the Technical Review Committee meeting that was held on Thursday, February 19, 2019:

- 1. Chamber of Commerce: No comments.
- 2. Department of Forestry: No comments.
- 3. Erosion and Sediment Control: No comments.
- 4. Fire Chief: No comments.
- 5. Environmental Health Dept.: No comments.
- 6. Sheriff's Office responded <u>via email on February 7, 2019</u> with the following comment: "I reviewed the properties and have no problem with any of them."
- 7. Public Works: No comments.
- 8. VDOT: Adjacent to the road is a ditch with an embankment. VDOT advised the applicants to be mindful when creating their entrance and be sure to check the left side sight distance. Additionally, this project needs to meet VDOT's low volume entrance standards. Last but not least, applicant needs to ensure that the shoulders are laid back.

- 9. Patricia Eager, Board of Supervisors: Commented that this project has already been approved previously, so she does not foresee any issues.
- 10. Emergency Services: No comments.
- 11. Building Official: Questioned who will be the owner of the tower because if it is the property owner, they will need a building permit.
- 12. Communications Officer: No comments.

Atlantic Technology Consultants' Review of Tower

Per the report submitted on March 7, 2019 by Fluvanna County's Tower Consultant, George Condyles, the following conditions are recommended before approval of SUP 19:01 (Attachment E):

- 1. Completion of the NEPA Report with review comments from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality prior to the issuance of a Building Permit.
- 2. The Applicant should summit the Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey to The Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Historic Resources and receive comments prior to issuance of the Building Permit.

Conclusion:

The Board of Supervisors should consider that a very similar tower proposal has previously been approved by both the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors for this parcel. Additionally, the Board should consider that this application was approved 5-0 by the Planning Commission on March 12, 2019.

Recommended Conditions

If approved, Staff recommends the following conditions:

- 1) The tower structure shall not exceed 199 feet. This does not include antennae, lighting, lightning rods, and other ancillary equipment, subject to FAA regulations.
- 2) The applicant secures all necessary permits required, and submits structural design and certification by a Virginia Registered Professional Engineer that the proposed facility, as built, will comply with EIA/TIA 222-G for the wind zone for Fluvanna County; Virginia;
- 3) Completion of the NEPA Report with review comments from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality prior to the issuance of a Building Permit;
- 4) The Applicant should summit the Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey to The Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Historic Resources and receive comments prior to issuance of the Building Permit;
- 5) The applicant shall secure the necessary permits required by Fluvanna County and VDOT;

- 6) The applicant shall provide space on the TASF for the County's Public Safety antennas and feed lines at the designed elevations. Space for ground level electronic equipment shall also be provided;
- 7) The facility when completed shall be accessible only to authorized personnel;
- 8) The tower shall be a self-support lattice Class III tower;
- 9) The facility shall meet the landscaping and screening requirements of the Fluvanna County Zoning Ordinance;
- 10) If the structures should no longer be needed, the applicant shall remove them, and restore the grounds to the prior condition;
- 11) The support structure is to be sufficient to support antennas of a like design for at least six (6) wireless service providers per Section 22-27-9.8 (10) of the Fluvanna County Zoning Ordinance;
- 12) The tower shall be in the same location as shown in the application;
- 13) Violation of any condition of this permit shall be grounds for revocation of this permit, and:
- 14) The Board of Supervisors, or their representative, has the right to inspect the property for compliance with these conditions at any time.
- 15) The facility shall be constructed and receive final inspection from the Fluvanna County Department of Building Inspections within eighteen (18) months of the date of approval of the special use permit

Additional Considerations

These fifteen (15) conditions were approved by the Planning Commission on March 12, 2019. These are the same conditions that were approved by the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors on October 24, 2012 and November 20, 2012, respectively. On March 13, 2019 the applicant, Jamie Adams, contacted the Planning Department requesting to amend two of the fifteen conditions. The applicant requests the following changes be made to the conditions:

- The applicant requests that Condition #6 be deleted or amended due to the legality of the condition.
- The applicant requests that Condition #15 be amended to the same conditions requested of other Special Use Permits which requires that constructing/developing the project must be <u>initiated</u> within 24 months of approval. Submittal of a site development plan would be considered initiation of development.

Suggested Motion:

I move that the Board of Supervisors [approve/deny/defer] the amendments to Conditions #6 and #15 requested by the applicant.

I move that the Board of Supervisors [approve/deny/defer] SUP 19:01 with respect to 12.7 acres of Tax Map 39, Section A, Parcel 29; [if approved] subject to the fifteen (15) conditions listed in the staff report.

telecommunications facility and associated ground equipment with respect to 12.7 acres of Tax Map 39, Section A, Parcel 29.

Existing Zoning: A-1, Agricultural, General

Planning Area: Rural Preservation Planning Area

Zoning Ordinance: Section 22-27-1

Location: The affected property is zoned A-1 and is located on the north side

of West River Road (U.S. Route 6), one mile west of its

intersection with Rolling Road (Route 620). (Attachment B)

Existing Land Use: Vacant land

Adjacent Land Use: The surrounding area is zoned A-1, Agricultural, General and is

very low-density residential in nature.

Neighborhood Meeting:

With the exception of the applicant, there were no attendees at the neighborhood meeting.

Technical Review Committee:

At the August 9, 2012 Technical Review Committee meeting, VDOT stated that the entrance would require a permit, and would be treated like a low-volume commercial/private entrance, and that 21A stone, approximately 6 to 8 inches in depth would be required back to the VDOT right-of-way;

The Fire Dept. requested that space be available for Fluvanna County's 911 equipment;

The Health Department stated that the proposed wireless communication tower appears to have no environmental impact, and that there are no homes, septic systems or wells located on this property. (Attachment C).

Planning Commission:

At the September 26, 2012 Planning Commission meeting, staff requested deferral of this request to the October 24, 2012 meeting pending a recommendation and further evaluation from Cityscape Consultants.

Comprehensive Plan:

The Comprehensive Plan designates this area as within the Rural Residential Planning Area. The Infrastructure Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan has the following recommendations concerning the siting of cellular towers.

- Encourage the location and co-location of wireless communication equipment on existing structures;
- Accommodate the growing need and demand for wireless communication services;
- Encourage coordination between communication providers;
- Establish consistent and balanced legal language governing wireless communications facilities that take into consideration the Comprehensive Plan and communications master plan; and
- Maintain compliance with applicable laws, including but not limited to the 1996 Telecommunications Act.

The above recommendations are the primary reasons the county has procured a telecommunications consultant to assist with these applications.

Analysis:

When evaluating proposed uses for special use permits, in addition to analyzing the potential adverse impacts of the use, staff utilizes two (2) general guidelines for evaluation as set forth in the zoning ordinance.

First, the proposed use should not tend to change the character and established pattern of the area or community.

The character and established pattern of the area where the communications facility is proposed is rural, not highly populated, and has land involved in agricultural production. According to the Virginia Department of Transportation, the entire segment of Route 6 in Fluvanna County is designated as a Virginia Byway. "Per Virginia Code, a Virginia Byway means those highways designated by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) pursuant to articles §33.1-62 through §33.1-66. The Virginia Outdoors Plan, from the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), identifies roads that have been considered as having intrinsic qualities of Virginia Byways for many years".

To be considered, a segment of road must substantially meet the following criteria:

- The route provides important scenic values and experiences;
- There is diversity of experiences, as in transition from one landscape scene to another;
- The route links together or provides opportunities to leave high-speed routes for variety and leisure in motoring. Landscape control or management along the route is feasible;
- The route allows for additional features that will enhance the motorist's experience and improve safety;
- Local government(s) has/have initiated zoning or other land-use controls, so as to reasonably protect the aesthetic and cultural value of the highway. (Attachment D)

Staff conducted a site visit on Monday, August 27, 2012, in order to assess the potential visual impacts of the proposed tower, and also to observe the balloon test. Weather conditions that day were sunny, dry, and cool with little wind. Staff concluded that the tower would be visible from portions of West River Road (Route 6), at the subject parcel, but minimally visible when traveling east or west away from the subject parcel. The tower would also be clearly visible from portions of the Rosewood Manor Rural Cluster subdivision located south of the site. The proposed tower would be situated in an open space, with little to no existing vegetation in which to screen the facility from Route 6. The balloon was also visible from neighboring properties and roadways, including the Fluvanna Baptist Church located adjacent to the south. In consideration of the proximity of the proposed tower's location to West River Road (Route 6), a Virginia Byway, the proposed facility could also be concealed as a firetower or other similar structure that would better blend with the rural character of the area. As proposed, it appears that a tower sited at this location could change the character and established pattern of the area, and/or create impacts that may be regarded as less than sensitive to its scenic beauty. (Attachment E)

Second, the proposed use should be compatible with the uses permitted by-right in that zoning district and shall not adversely affect the use/or value of neighboring property.

This is a rural area, and all of the surrounding property is zoned A-1 (Agricultural General). Since the proposed tower will be less than 200 feet, it will not have to be lighted. The applicant is proposing to build a 195 foot non-concealed freestanding antenna support facility within a 125 foot x 125 foot lease area, which per Sec. 22-27-8, requires a special use permit, and is not permitted by-right. Some permitted by-right uses in the A-1 zoning district include single-family dwellings, minor utilities, hunting preserves, public parks, home occupations, private kennels, group homes, and temporary sawmills to name a few. The definition of a minor utility is: "Facilities for the distribution and collection of public, private, and central utilities including poles, lines, transformers, pipes, meters, and communication and distribution lines".

When evaluating an application for a proposed new telecommunication antenna support facility (TASF), siting of new facilities shall be in accordance with Sec. 22-27-8, the siting preference table. The applicant is proposing to construct a new 195 foot non-concealed freestanding antenna support facility (monopole). The subject property is zoned A-1 (Agricultural, General), and in accordance with the siting preference table, this application requires a special use permit and public hearing process.

Pursuant to Sec. 22-27-9.8, all new telecommunication antenna support facilities shall meet the requirements of that section. Staff has evaluated the application, and it appears all of the requirements of this section have been met.

According to the Fluvanna County Wireless Master Plan, the area of the proposed tower is absent of sufficient telecommunications service, and could accommodate all of the service providers with a uniform and dependable signal 24/7. The applicant has stated in their application, that "the tower will be designed to support a minimum of six collocations and the fenced compound will house a variety of support buildings and equipment pads". The ability to accommodate more collocations could result in a need for fewer new towers. The applicant has also stated that "the facility will provide wireless services, telephone and broadband, along the Route 6 corridor and surrounding area". Also, one radiation center on the tower and a 10' x 20' space in the compound will be made available for Fluvanna County's 911 equipment on a rent free basis".

The applicant proposes to construct and maintain a leased telecommunication facility on the north side of West River Road (U.S. Route 6), one mile west of its intersection with Rolling Road (Route 620). The proposed facility would be comprised of a 195 foot monopole tower with the potential for multiple carriers, along with peripheral ground equipment. The proposed site will be within an 80 x 90 fenced area, surrounded by a (125 ft. x 125 ft.) lease area. (Attachment F)

Conclusion:

It is the consensus of Cityscape Consultants and County Staff that our Telecommunications Facilities Master Plan is not currently up-to-date. It is not clear if this application is in conformance with the Master Plan, and/or consistent with the needs of telecommunications subscribers in the immediate subject area. Further, the subject property is not identified in the

current Master Plan as a proposed tower site, nor has a lease agreement been provided with this application.

Cityscape Consultants has stated that they are not prepared to render a recommendation at this time. Due to out-of-date information on the existing Master Plan, Cityscape Consultants will not be able to render a determination. Therefore, it is not clear if this request for a special use permit for a 195 ft. monopole telecommunication facility is in substantial conformance with the intent of the Telecommunications Master Plan. (Attachment G)

If the Planning Commission wishes to consider this request, then consideration should be given to the potential for visual impacts to the Route 6 Virginia Byway, and to nearby properties, and also to whether or not this application is in conformance with the Telecommunications Master Plan and the Telecommunications Facilities Ordinance. Given the proximity of the proposed facility to the Byway, the Commission may also wish to consider requiring a concealed facility instead of the proposed non-concealed facility. If approved, staff recommends the following conditions:

- 1) The tower, including antennae, will not be higher than 199 ft. and will not be lit;
- 2) The applicant secures all necessary permits required, and submits structural design and certification by a Virginia Registered Professional Engineer that the proposed facility, as built, will comply with EIA/TIA 222-G for the wind zone for Fluvanna County; Virginia;
- 3) Prior to issuance of building permits the applicant shall submit satisfactory SHPO and NEPA documentation;
- 4) The applicant shall secure the necessary permits required by Fluvanna County and VDOT;
- 5) The applicant shall provide space on the TASF for the County's Public Safety antennas and feed lines at the highest designed elevation. Space for ground level electronic equipment shall also be provided;
- 6) The facility when completed shall be accessible only to authorized personnel;
- 7) The tower shall be a monopole, and shall be engineered with breakpoint technology;
- 8) The facility shall install the necessary landscaping buffer;
- 9) The applicant shall install an emergency generator to ensure continuity of telecommunications operations in the event of a disaster or major power outage; and provisions for such generators shall include additional special treatments; for diesel, a fuel retaining area for propane, ignition separation requirements; and that generator testing shall occur only between 9 AM and 4 PM Monday through Friday; and the same shall be noted on the site development plan;
- 10) If the structures should no longer be needed, the applicant shall remove them, and restore the grounds to the prior condition;
- 11) The support structure is to be sufficient to support antennas of a like design for at least six (6) wireless service providers;
- 12) The tower shall be in the same location as shown in the application;
- 13) Violation of any condition of this permit shall be grounds for revocation of this permit, and;
- 14) The Board of Supervisors, or their representative, has the right to inspect the property for compliance with these conditions at any time.

National Communication Towers L.C. ("National") as lessee, hereby applies for a Special Use Permit to allow a telecommunications facility and accessory structures on leased land. The leased land is located on property known by Tax Map Parcel 39-A-29. The parcel is located on the north side of Rt. 6 approximately 5 miles west of Rt. 620, Kidds Store. According to the tax records of Fluvanna County it is owned by Colonel Robert K. Spencer, P.O. Box 52, Scottsville, VA 24590.

National is requesting a Special Use Permit to allow a self support Monopole Tower, measuring approximately 195' in height with a 4' lightning rod, to be located within a leased area, measuring 125' x 125'. The facility will be designed to allow multiple collocations on the tower and within a secure fenced compound area. The exact number and types of future users is difficult to predict, however the tower will be designed to accommodate a mix of carrier types. The design mix will include: 6 or more users of panel antennas (typically 15 panels, 12" wide X 72" high, per user). Likewise, the compound area is designed to accommodate a mix of shelter types and sizes as denoted on the drawings submitted with this application.

The 12.7 acre parcel is zoned A1. According to the Fluvanna County zoning ordinance, telecommunication facilities are permitted on A1 zoned properties, with Special Use Permits. Proper setback distances have been observed and are denoted on the enclosed plans.

National develops telecommunication facilities for collocations by cellular, PCS, paging and other wireless services which rely upon a network of elevated platforms in areas where the carriers have gaps in signal coverage, or "holes." Such a hole exists along the Route 6 corridor. Supported by propagation studies, National believes a communications facility located on the subject parcel will enable carriers to fill this gap, while minimizing the effect on surrounding property owners.

The FCC has authorized several carriers to provide wireless services in this part of Cumberland County. Those carriers include: Sprint, AT&T, Verizon Wireless U.S. Cellular and Ntelos.

The facility will be in continuous operation but will produce no interference with other types of communications including: radio, television, cable TV, garage door openers or other consumer electronic equipment. No offices will be constructed on the site, so neither sewer nor water facilities will be required. The facility will produce no refuse, noise, vibration, dust, glare, odors or fumes. Neither National nor any of the tower users will introduce hazardous or toxic substances to the site. After completion of construction, the only traffic associated with the site will be short visits by technicians on a monthly basis to test or replace equipment components. In most instances towers below 200'are not required by the FAA to be lit.

The facility will provide a vital public safety service to this part of the County in two important ways. First, the County may co-locate antennas for law enforcement and fire and rescue at the 195' radiation Center along with a 10' X 20' space inside of the compound on rent free bases. Second, this new facility will enable wireless services to be extended to this part of the County, enabling the public at large to utilize those services for important medical or life-safety calls.

The proposed use conforms to the provisions of all applicable ordinances, regulations, adopted standards and conditions. National is not seeking any wavier or variance for the proposed use at this time. National respectfully requests the approval of this Special Use Permit application.

Adventure beckons on the roads and highways designated as Virginia Byways. More than mere pavement between points A and B, a Virginia Byway offers travelers a side of the Commonwealth that is uncommon and enlightening. Each byway leads to scenes of natural beauty and places of historical and social significance.

Currently, there are nearly 3,000 miles of roads designated as Virginia Byways, yet several hundred more miles of Commonwealth roadway could qualify. To help attract visitors and support economic development through tourism, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) and the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB), encourage local governments to nominate roads for Virginia Byway designation.

What's the purpose of the Virginia Byway program?

The program identifies road corridors containing aesthetic or cultural value near areas of historical, natural or recreational significance. By designating certain roads as Virginia Byways, widely distributing "A Map of Scenic Roads in Virginia,"and promoting the Virginia Scenic Roads Web site, the program encourages travel to interesting destinations and away from high-traffic corridors.

Byways also stimulate local economies by attracting visitors to lesser-known destinations. One study showed visitors spent \$1.8 billion in counties adjacent to the Blue Ridge Parkway in Virginia and North Carolina. This supported nearly 75,000 jobs and generated more than \$147 million in tax revenues in the region.

What makes a Virginia Byway different from other roads?

People like to explore. The 2000 Virginia Outdoors Survey, conducted by Virginia's Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), finds that driving for pleasure is the second most popular outdoor activity, with more than 62% of the population participating.

By following the highlighted byways on the state transportation map, the scenic roads map and the scenic roads Web site, visitors are directed to places where they can tour wineries, explore Civil War battle sites and historical attractions, view beautiful scenery and enjoy recreational resources.

Once designated, a byway becomes part of the coordinated promotional strategy for Virginia tourism.

What are other important considerations regarding Virginia Byway status?

- · Virginia Byway designation gives localities the opportunity to participate in the National Scenic Byway Program.
- It might limit placement of outdoor advertising signs.
- · It does not affect land use controls.
- · It does not limit road improvements.

What is a Virginia Byway?

Per Virginia Code, "Virginia Byway" means those highways designated by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) pursuant to articles §33.1-62 through §33.1-66. The Virginia Outdoors Plan, from DCR, identifies roads that have been considered as having intrinsic qualities of Virginia Byways for many years. In addition, there are other roads that meet the criteria for designation.

What are the criteria?

To be considered, a segment of road must substantially meet the following criteria:

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- The route provides important scenic values and experiences.
- There is a diversity of experiences, as in transition from one landscape scene to another.
- · The route links together or provides access to scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, natural and archeological elements.
- · The route bypasses major roads or provides opportunities to leave high-speed routes for variety and leisure in motoring. Landscape control or management along the route is feasible.
- The route allows for additional features that will enhance the motorist's experience and improve safety.
- · Local government(s) has/have initiated zoning or other land-use controls, so as to reasonably protect the aesthetic and cultural value of the highway.

What are the steps to designation?

- 1. Anyone can request byway designation, but local government(s) must adopt a resolution of support.
- 2. Upon receipt of a request and historical documentation from an interested party/local government, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) collect information on local zoning laws, traffic volumes and accident reports before evaluating the roads according to the criteria.
- 3. Based on a joint review according to the criteria, the DCR Director recommends qualifying roads for consideration by the CTB.
- 4. Before the CTB acts, VDOT offers the local government the opportunity to hold a public hearing. If a public hearing is requested, VDOT's Local Assistance Division and DCR will provide assistance.
- 5. After the public hearing, or if no hearing was requested, the CTB officially designates the byway(s) at their next scheduled meeting. Subsequently, signs are posted, and changes are made to the appropriate maps.







VDOT STANDARD GENERAL NOTES

EFFECTIVE DATE JANUARY 1, 2007

1.All materials and construction within the public right of way shall be in accordance with current Viriginia Department of Transportation's specifications, standards, current work area protection, manual, and all applicable location and design instructional and informational

2.Land Use Permit (CE-7) must be obtained from the Virginia Department of Transportation prior to beginning any construction within the existing state maintained right of way (including access).

3.VDOT is to receive written notification 48 hours prior to commencing with initial construction

4.Prior to any construction, the contractor shall consult the engineer and verify the approval of the plans by all applicable federal, state and local agencies.

5.Preliminary design of the pavement structure for all subdivision streets shall be in accordance with the current edition of The <u>Pavement Design Guide for Subdivision and Secondary Roads in Virginia</u>. The completed design worksheet appendix IV saidle included with the initial plan submittal for each proposed povement section utilizing the predicted soil support value shown in appendix I of <u>The Pavement Design Guide</u>.

6.The contractor shall verify the elevations of all points of connection or proposed work to existing curbs, sanitary lines, water lines, etc., prior to construction.

7.Upon discovery of soils that are unsuitable for foundations, sub-grades, or other roadway construction purposes, the contractor shall immediately contact a geotechnical engineer and VDOT. These areas shall be excavated below plan grade as directed by a geotechnical engineer, backfilled with suitable material and compacted in accordance with current VDOT specifications.

8.All storm sewer design and construction to be in accordance with VDOT 18 11D-94 (D) 121.13.

9.All drainage structures shall be in accordance with current versions of LD-97 (D) 121. Pipe within the right of way shall be a minimum CL-III or greater in accordance with current VDOT standards and specifications.

10.All pre-cast units shall be VDOT approved. Certification and VDOT stamp will be required on all units. Shop drawings, Geotechnical data and soil bearing capacity, and plan view shall be submitted as package for VDOT review and approval.

11. All concrete shall be minimum class A3-AE (air entrained 3,000 PSI).

12.All entrances are to be designed and constructed in accordance with current VDOT standards.

Residential lot access shall be provided per the following criteria:

*All driveway entrance culverts are to be a minimum of 15" diameter x 20' long pipe and shall conform to PE-1 private entrance standards unless otherwise directed by the Resident Engineer. No entrance culverts are to be installed within five (5) feet of a property corner.

*VDOT standard CG-9D entrances shall be installed in curb and gutter neighborhoods. Inspections to be performed by VDOT shall be requested in writing, 48 hours prior to entrance installation.

13. The developer is responsible for furnishing and installing all signs deemed pertinent to the proposed development. The contractor shall contact VDOT inspection staff to establish locations for any signage requirements as deemed necessary by VDOT. Installation of said signs shall occur at no expense to the state and prior to state acceptance of roadway(s).

14.Design changes, specified materials changes and/or field changes from the approved plans need to be re-submitted to VDOT prior to proceeding with the work. A letter of explanation shall accompany the revised plans and/or drainage calculations, which must be submitted, to VDOT for review and approval by the Resident Engineer.

15.Contractor shall verify location and elevation of all underground utilities shown on plans in areas of construction prior to starting work. Contact engineer immediately if location or elevation is different from that shown on plan. If there appears to be a conflict, and/or upon discovery of any utility and shown on this plan, call Miss Utility at 1-800-552-7001. The developer shall be responsible for the relocation of any utility within existing and/or proposed right of way required by the development.

16.All streetlights shall be located a minimum of 9.5' from the edge of pavement on curb and gutter streets and/or located a minimum of 5.5' behind the ditch line on open ditch streets.

17. Generally, paved roadside ditches are to be specified when velocities exceed current VDOT design criteria or when ditch slopes are less than 0.75%. Where ditch slopes exceed 5.0%, the developer may choose to implement erosion and sediment control measures in an attempt to achieve channel stabilization while acknowledging that additional paved ditch linings may be required prior to acceptance of the roads into the secondary system of state highways. Paved roadside ditches shall conform to VDOT-PG-2A standards and specifications.

18.VDOT and County approval of construction plans does not preclude the right to require additional facilities as deemed necessary for acceptance of the roads into the VDOT Secondary Road System.

19.VDOT approval of site plans will expire five (5) years from the date of the initial approval. VDOT approval of subdivision plans will expire three (3) years from the date of the initial approval.

20.VDOT shall have performed the required field inspection (proof roll) prior to placement of the aggregate base course(s). Contact VDOT, in writing, for subgrade inspection 48 hours prior to scheduling placement of aggregate base course(s).

21.A prime coat seal between the aggregate base and bituminous concrete will be required at a rate of 0.30 gallons per square yard (REC-250 Prime Coat) per VDOT standards and specifications.

23.VDOT shall have approved all base course(s) for depth, template and performed the required field inspection (visual, proof roll, compaction or any additional as determined by VDOT inspector) prior to placement of any surface course(s). Contact VDOT, in writing, for inspection of the base course(s) 48 hours prior to application of the surface course(s).

24.An actual copy of the complete CBR report is to be submitted to VDOT in conjunction with final pavement designs. All pavement design recommendations shall be performed in accordance with the current edition of The Pavement Design Guide for Subdivision and Secondary Roads in Virginia.

25.A licensed geotechnical engineer shall ascertain cause and certify recommended method of repair for all pavement structural failures prior to state acceptance.

26.All vegetation and organic material is to be removed from the right of way limits prior to conditioning of the subgrade. 27.Dry gutter is not allowed in VDOT right of way.

28. The developer will be responsible for the design costs of any traffic signal installation and/or modification under an account receivable with VDOT.

29. The necessity and locations for additional VDOT standard underdrains to be determined at time of subgrade inspection.

30.Approval of a detailed construction sequencing/maintenance of traffic narrative for the work zone is a prerequisite for issuance of a Land Use Permit allowing access to and construction within VDOT maintained right-of-way.

31.VDOT shall be provided documentation by a licensed geotechnical engineer, certifying that all in-place pavements meet or exceed the approved pavement design thickness prior to state acceptance. The certifying documentation shall conform to VDOT specifications and the approved plans.

32.The establishment of a temporary vegetative cover is required on all denuded areas that are not to be fine graded for periods longer than 30 days.

33.No structure shall be constructed on state maintained rights of way unless said structures are shown on road construction plans approved by VDOT or covered by a VDOT Land Use Permit (or by a letter of intent from the Resident Engineer to issue said permit at the time of state acceptance). 34. The developer is responsible for contacting the Fredericksburg District Traffic Engineering section at 540-899-4300 for guardrall location and placement requirements.

35.A preconstruction meeting is required prior to undertaking any roadway construction activities. Developer or designee will contact Fredericksburg Residency, in writing, five working days in advance of anticipated construction start to establish date, time and location for preconstruction meeting. The primary function of the construction meeting will be to identify geotechnical parameters of proposed construction activities.


36.Existing pavement markings within state Right of Way are to be eradicated (all eradication scars shall be overlaid with surface mix or slurry seal *4).

All new striping requires the use of Thermoplastic pavement markings. Contact District Traffic Engineering office at 540-899-4300 ten days prior to proceeding for striping layout.

37.A geotech report shall verify/approve stone depths prior to asphalt placement.

38.All construction debris, materials, dumpsters, etc shall be located outside the roadway prism prior to acceptance of the roads and shall be maintained outside the roadway prism within existing state routes.

39. Any landscaping, identification signs, lighting, etc. that may be indicated within the construction plans shall be for information purposes only. Non-standard items must be approved by separate submittal through the permitting process.

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


Figure 40: Projected new infrastructure infill sites

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

National Communication Towers LLC (NCT) has made application to the County for the issuance of a Special Use Permit to allow construction of a new 199-ft Lattice SSV telecommunications support tower on property located off of Route 6 owned by Ernest and Rose Butler of 15 Lantre Lane, Scottsville, VA 24590. The exact location is 37-47-48.7 N & 078-22-32.6 W

NCT has a commitment from AT&T Wireless. This tower will provide vertical space for both Licensed and Unlicensed Broadband Service providers and Licensed Land mobile Radio carriers such as AT&T.

RECOMMENDATIONS

This request for approval to construct a Lattice SSV tower with lightning rod for an overall height of 199' AGL as proposed represents an appreciable intent on the part of the Applicant to conform to all applicable federal, state, and local regulations, accepted industry practices, and specific County ordinances regarding construction of new telecommunications towers.

The consultant recommends:

- Completion of the NEPA Report with review comments from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality prior to the issuance of a Building Permit.
- The Applicant should summit the Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey to The Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Historic Resources and receive comments prior to issuance of the Building Permit.

If these recommendations are agreed upon by the Applicant, the consultant will request the County approve the Application/Request for issuance of a Special Use Permit to allow construction of this site.

This report outlines the specific areas of evaluation with respect to this proposal, and details this consultant's analysis and recommendations regarding the site plans and proposal as presented.


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1.0 TECHNICAL

1.1 Siting


The proposed tower site is a 15,625 s.f. lease area of unimproved open and forested farm land situated within a 12.7 acre parent parcel owned by Ernest and Rose Butler of 15 Lantre Lane, Scottsville, VA.

The proposed project Site Plans were prepared by the firm of JMT Engineers of Richmond, VA, by Project Engineer Mr. Jeffrey Cronin, P.E. on January 11, 2019.



The proposed tower is a lattice SSV tower with a lightning rod at a total of 199-ft to be placed within a 90'x 80' fenced compound. (See Site Plan below)

The site will be accessed from Rt. 6, West River Road.



The center of the proposed tower is located at coordinates 37° 47' 48.7" N and 78° 22' 32.6" W (NAD 83). The parcel is zoned: A-1 (Agricultural) on Tax Map # 39-A-29.

1.2 Topography


The topography of this site is relatively flat. The ground elevation for the proposed tower is 461' above sea level. The tower is proposed at an overall height of 199'. Combining the Ground elevation of 461' + 199' would give an Average Mean Above Sea Level of 660' AMSL.

The Consultant has reviewed the information supplied and concurs to the height of the tower as conditions relative to the topography.


Site placement is in an open field at the center of the property. The access to the site is through a proposed gravel road that is shielded by pine and hardwood trees. The existing tree canopy is between 40 and 70 feet to the north, east and west. The South side will be exposed to the open field.

1.3 Setbacks

The proposed site is over 545' from the nearest primary road, Rt.6 West River Road, to the south. All property line setbacks required for this area have been observed in the drawing (2 of 2) of the enclosed site survey performed by Shadrach and Associates, LLC, including those with respect to nearby residences and adjacent property lines.



As noted in the application package the proposed tower is approximately 112' feet from the nearest adjacent property line which is in compliance with the County's setback requirements.




The Consultant believes with the height of the trees and the close proximity of the trees to Rt. 6, there will be an extremely limited view of the proposed tower.



1.4 Co-Location

While co-location is preferable to construction of a new site, with such colocation minimizing visual impact of telecommunications equipment on the surrounding area, no additional sites are available in the area which would meet the Applicant's coverage objectives.



The Applicant has submitted a map of existing tower sites within a 5-mile radius of the proposed tower site. (See Map below)

The Applicant, NCT, is placing a structure in an area where no other structure is suitable (by height or location) for co-location of wireless radio antennas.

The consultant concurs with this assessment.

Letter of Intent

In addition, a letter of intent has been submitted by AT&T. The report includes maps which demonstrate the lack of coverage along that portion of Rt. 6 Kidd's Store area, and the surrounding areas where the Applicant proposes to build the new 199' Lattice SSV tower.

The Applicant has considered the existing towers located within the 5-mile radius for co-location, but has determined none of the towers would satisfy their coverage needs or they are currently co-located on the tower.

ATC concurs that there is no potential of co-location on existing structures.

This site is a "fill in" site and a major site within the overall scheme of the new AT&T network.

The construction of the facility as proposed will verifiably meet the stated coverage objectives of the Applicant. The application makes detailed reference to all applicable points of consideration regarding County preference for colocation of equipment on existing structures versus new tower construction and clearly demonstrates how new construction of this site is the only viable way of achieving the desired system coverage goals.

1.5 Structural

The proposed 199' Lattice SSV tower design is of high strength steel, and represents a highly stable structural design not known by this consultant to have failed at any installation in this region. This structure, as proposed, is well within compliance of EIA/TIA-222-G guidelines for structures mandated ability to withstand the structural loading of all appurtenances, plus additional wind and ice loading.

This tower structure, as proposed, would allow room for future co-location of at least <u>six (6) wireless Land Mobile Radio carriers as well as at least 4 more WiSPs</u> at the same site, minimizing the number of towers needed for all wireless telecommunications carriers to eventually optimize service in this area.

Furthermore, in conformance with County, work at this site will remain in compliance with ALL federal, state, and local building codes and regulations if work proceeds as outlined in the application. The applicant's proposal includes site plans representing a soundly engineered design conforming to industry standards.

1.6 RF Exposure

FCC bulletin OET-65 provides guidance for a licensee proposing to construct a telecommunications support structure in calculation of RF exposure limitations, including analysis of the cumulative effect of all transmitters on the structure. Appropriate steps, including warning signage at the site, will be taken to protect both the general public and site workers from unsafe RF exposure in accordance with federal guidelines.

NCT has agreed to be in compliance with all FCC requirements.

The consultant sees no evidence of unsafe RF exposure levels being generated at this site if it were to proceed as proposed.

RF site exposure warning signage placement is appropriately planned for this site.

1.7 **Grounding**

Grounding of all structures and equipment at an RF site is critically important to the safety of both personnel and equipment at the site. Even a single component not meeting this standard places all other site components at risk for substantial damage. All structures and equipment at the site should maintain a ground potential difference of less than 5 ohms. If construction proceeds as proposed, all structures and equipment shall be appropriately grounded and any obvious grounding deficiencies rectified for safety purposes and minimizing the potential for a situation to occur requiring mitigation.

These concerns will be addressed when Construction Drawings are submitted for a Building Permit. The Consultant recommends that the NEC and Virginia Statewide Building Code will define the requirements

1.8 General Safety

This site compound will be surrounded by suitable 90'x 80' 8-ft high chain linked fence with barbed wire to prevent unauthorized access to the tower site, as clearly indicated in the proposed site plans. Additional safety measures to be placed at this site should include:

- RF exposure warning signage
- Site identification information
- Routine and Emergency contact information
- No Trespassing signs

Furthermore, OSHA-approved style of fall prevention cable and an anti-climbing device shall be installed.

1.9 Interference

An interference study, taking into account all proximally located transmitters and receivers known to be active in the area are advisable prior to any new tower construction.

The Applicant, NCT, has agreed to the requirements of monitoring and resolving any radio interference that may be attributed to this structure if any interference would occur.

Practically speaking this consultant sees no evidence of interference by or with this site after a general evaluation of the surrounding transmitter sites.

Should any interference issues be posed with respect to this site, mitigation would nevertheless remain the responsibility of the FCC License Owner and affected carrier(s), and would be regulated by the Federal Communication Commission and/or the Federal Aviation Administration, having no effect or burden on the County.

2.0 PROCEDUREAL

2.1 FAA Study

A full FAA Study to determine potential Air Hazard requirements was not required for this tower because of the TOWAIR Report below stating there is no Air Hazard for this Application.

This site will not require lighting.



2.2 FCC Antenna Site Registration

This site will not require registration with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).



2.3 Environmental Impacts

The National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), delineated in Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1, Subpart I, sections 1.1301-1.1319, requires federal agencies to incorporate environmental considerations into their decision-making process when evaluating new construction proposals. As a licensing agency, the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) requires all licensees to consider the potential environmental effects from their construction of antenna support structures, and to disclose those effects in an Environmental Assessment (EA) that must be filed with the FCC for review.

The Applicant has not submitted a NEPA Review. This should be done by the Licensed FCC wireless provider prior to issuance of a Building Permit.

The Consultant has made a visit to the site and sees "no impact" with respect to this proposed tower site.

2.4 Historic Impacts

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (NHPA) requires that State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPO) and the President's Advisory Council on Historic Preservation be given a reasonable opportunity to comment on all undertakings with the potential to affect historic properties. Prior to construction, the licensee is required to submit to the SHPO a detailed description of the project, a listing of local historic resources, and a discussion of any measures being undertaken to mitigate impacts (if any) on historic resources. Upon receipt, the SHPO has thirty (30) days to review and respond to those submissions. All agencies with authority to permit construction are required to consider the SHPO response in its decision making process with respect to new construction applications.

The Applicant has not submitted a Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey.

The Applicant should submit the Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey to the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Historic Resources and receive comments prior to issuance of the Building Permit.

3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

This request for approval to construct a 199-ft Lattice SSV tower as proposed represents an appreciable intent on the part of the Applicant to conform to all applicable federal, state, and local regulations, accepted industry practices, and specific County ordinances regarding construction of new telecommunications towers.

The design presented represents sound engineering and an effort to select a site of minimal visual impact to the surrounding area.

The Consultant recommends:

- 1. Completion of the NEPA Report with review comments from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality.
- The Applicant should submit the Phase 1 Cultural Resource Survey to the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Historic Resources and receive comments prior to issuance of the Building Permit.

If these recommendations are agreed upon by the Applicant, the consultant will request the County approve the Application/Request for issuance of a Special Use Permit to allow construction of this site.

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

SUMMARY

The Director of Public Utilities performs complex professional and difficult administrative work directing all activities of the Public Utilities Department; does related work as required. Duties involve all aspects of utilities management dealing with financing, budgeting, personnel, short- and long-term planning, public relations, property acquisition and operational control as well as liaison between management, staff and residents of Fluvanna County. Supervision is exercised over all department personnel, which consists of skilled labor and general labor positions in the functional areas of water and sewer systems development, operation, and management. Work is performed under general supervision of the County Administrator.

SUMMARY

The Fluvanna County Fire and Rescue Chief oversees all fire and rescue operations in the county. The incumbent:

- Plans, organizes, and implements fire suppression, prevention, education and emergency medical services (EMS) to prevent or minimize the loss of life and property.
- Works directly with the leadership of the Fluvanna County and Lake Monticello Fire Companies, EMS Squads, contracted EMS providers, and Water Rescue.
- Works closely with the Sheriff, the Director of Emergency Communications, and the County's Emergency Management Coordinator.

This position is subject to the Hazardous Duty retirement benefit, as outlined by the Virginia Retirement System. The Chief works under the general guidance and supervision of the County Administrator.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Performs a wide range of administrative, managerial, and supervisory duties to ensure the highest quality, and most efficient and effective emergency/fire operations.
- Ensures coordinated, effective and efficient fire and EMS services for the citizens of the county by coordinating the work of the volunteer fire companies and the volunteer rescue squads in collaboration with the volunteer chiefs.
- Coordinates the activities of the fire companies and rescue squads to achieve an integrated and effective fire, natural disaster, hazardous materials, and EMS system within the County.
- Responds to emergency incidents; provides incident command leadership and management, as needed; ensures safe work practices are followed.
- Serves as the principal county liaison to the Fire and Rescue Association (FRA).
- In collaboration with the FRA, plans and implements Fire and EMS programs, policies, and procedures.
- Reviews performance, effectiveness, and quality of the County's fire and EMS services, including any contracted fire or EMS service.
- Manages and directs contracts with third-party EMS provider; ensures compliance with federal, state and local laws and with contract specifications.
- Identifies, evaluates, and recommends new and innovative technology, equipment, and supplies.
- Coordinates with the FRA on development and presentation of an annual budget proposal to the County Administrator.
- Oversees the expenditure of the fire and rescue appropriations in collaboration with the volunteer chiefs.
- Review and oversite of apparatus preventive maintenance procedures and upkeep and maintenance of fire stations and service testing of apparatus.

- Plans and reviews specifications for new or replacement equipment; oversees fleet replacement guidelines in collaboration with the FRA and the concerned volunteer fire/rescue chief.
- Researches and presents grant opportunities to offset costs and improve County operations.
- In concert with the Fire and Rescue Association, develops and maintains a strong county-wide volunteer recruitment and retention program. Identifies and recommends incentives to help maintain a vibrant roster of fire and rescue volunteers for County agencies.
- Plans and implements fire and EMS training programs in collaboration with the FRA.
- Prepares and submits monthly fire and EMS activity reports to the County Administrator and other reports, as required.
- Provides periodic briefings to the Board of Supervisors, the fire companies, the rescue squads, and community organizations on fire and rescue operations and requirements.
- Meets with elected or appointed officials, other Fire/EMS officials, community and business leaders, and the public on all aspects of the Fire and EMS activities.
- Maintains public awareness; meets with news media for interviews and prepares press releases.
- Works with Building Inspections, Planning/Zoning, and other County departments on local projects and proposal development.
- Coordinates with Company Fire Chiefs on building construction plans proposed in their coverage areas; familiarity and enforcement of the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code with the Certified Fire Official for the County.
- Attends conferences and meetings to keep abreast of current trends in Fire and EMS fields.
- Represents Fluvanna County Fire & EMS in a variety of local, county, state and other meetings in conjunction with the volunteer chiefs.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

2.13. Leaves of Absence Leave and & Holidays

BOS Adopted – Jul 1, 2004 March 20, 2019

2.13.1. Annual Leave

A. Permanent County employees receive paid annual leave which can be taken for any purpose. Except in cases of illness or emergency, annual leave must be approved in advance. All full-time permanent employees of the County of Fluvanna shall be granted annual leave by the County as follows:

- B. Employees on vacation leave shall be paid their prevailing wage based on the prevailing scheduled work week. Annual leave is earned only upon completion of a full calendar monthpay period of employment. If an employee is absent for a period exceeding his or her earned leave balances, he or she will not earn annual leave for that period. Also, an employee will not earn annual leave during that portion of an absence with pay that exceeds 60 consecutive calendar days.
- C. Probationary employees will not normally be permitted to take vacation leave until satisfactory completion of their probationary period within 90 days of hire date. Exceptions may be approved by the Department Head on a need basis.
- D. Upon separation or retirement, a full-time employee shall be paid for all accrued annual leave, not to exceed the maximum amount of leave that can be carried to the next year, based on their approved Service Accumulation.
- E. In the event of death of the employee, the employee's estate will be paid for accumulated annual leave, not to exceed the maximum amount of leave that can be carried to the next year, based on their approved Service Accumulation.
- F. Annual leave accrued above the maximum <u>Service Accumulation rate</u> above, is lost by the employee <u>at the beginning of each new fiscal year.</u>
- G. Permanent part-time employees who work at least 20 hours per week, but less than 30, shall be entitled to annual leave equal to 50% of that earned by a full-time employee of equal tenure. Permanent part-time employees who work at least 30 hours per week, but less than a full-

time schedule, shall be entitled to annual leave equal to 75% of that earned by a full–time employee of equal tenure.

- H. Annual leave balances for employees who move from one Fluvanna County department to another, or the constitutional offices, will have those leave balances transferred in their entirety. If the transferred employee is terminated from their position within six (6) months of the hire date in the new position, then the employee's previous department is obligated to incur their prorated share of the leave balance payout assuming all leave balances initially transferred are reduced first by any leave the employee may have taken in the new department.
 - I. <u>Employees transferring from the Fluvanna County School System or Fluvanna County Social Services shall retain their employment tenure for the purposes of calculating leave accrual rates and allowable service accumulation carryover.</u>

2.13.2. <u>Sick Leave</u>

- A. Permanent employees may use sick leave for absences related to conditions that prevent them from performing their duties. These conditions include illness, injury, death in the immediate family, health problems, pregnancy, and childbirth. In cases of illness an employee shall notify his department head by telephone or messenger promptly. Employees may also use sick leave for medical appointments that cannot be scheduled outside of work hours.
- B. When these circumstances are known in advance, such as in cases of scheduled surgery or childbirth, employees should give their supervisors advance notice. A physician's certificate may be required by a department head or supervisor at any time as evidence of illness or scheduled medical appointment before compensation for such absence is allowed, but in any case a certificate certifying the reason for sick leave request shall be signed by the employee.
- C. When it becomes evident that an employee shall be unable to be at work for an extended period of time (three (3) consecutive working days), the employee must furnish the department head or supervisorHuman Resources with a written statement from his/her physician. This statement shall include the:
 - 1. Nature of the employee's condition;
- 2. Expected date on which the employee will be able to return and perform normal work duties (in cases where applicable); and
 - 3. Approximate anticipated date of medical release by the physician.
- D. The above medical statement shall also apply when an employee is unable to be at work for an illness in their immediate family as defined in B.4.(q) of this policy. An immediate family member shall be as defined in section 2-13-10.Bas spouse, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, grandchild, sibling, step-sibling, and any relative living in the employee's home.

- E. For Plan 1 and Plan 2 VRS members, sSick leave with pay shall be earned at the rate of 8 hours per full month worked for all full- time permanent employees. Sick leave shall be extended to all permanent part-time employees who work at least 20 hours per week, at a rate of 4 hours per month. Sick leave, if not exhausted in the year in which it accrues, may be carried over from year to year without limit. Employees shall retain all benefits and seniority while on approved sick leave.
- F. If an employee is absent for a period exceeding his or her earned leave balances, he or she will not earn sick leave for that pay period. Also, he or she will not earn sick leave during that portion of an absence with pay that exceeds 60 consecutive calendar days.
- G. An employee's abuse of this policysick leave usage may result in the employee's immediate dismissal from the County, or such other disciplinary action which may be appropriate.
- H. Employees on approved sick leave shall be paid their prevailing wage based on their usual prevailing scheduled work week not to exceed 40 hours per week.
- I. If an employee has five or more years of continuous service when County employment ends, he or she will be paid for twenty-five (25%) percent of the unused sick leave, not to exceed \$2,500.
- J. Sick time leave balances for employees who move from one Fluvanna County department to another, or the constitutional offices, will have those leave balances transferred in their entirety. If the transferred employee is terminated from their position within six (6) months of the hire date in the new position, then the employee's previous department is obligated to incur their prorated share of the leave balance payout assuming all leave balances initially transferred are reduced first by any leave the employee may have taken in the new department.
 - K. New Hybrid VRS Eligible Employees' Sick Leave.

 (Eff. 1-1-14) (BOS Approved October 16, 2013)

1. Employees enrolled in the VRS Hybrid plan will receive <u>County-paid</u> short-and long-term disability <u>insurance;</u> therefore, the sick leave plan for this <u>employee</u> group will be a lump sum <u>at the start of</u> each fiscal <u>year.</u> with not accrual or carry over or paid out when leave <u>employment.</u> This plan will not accrue sick leave during the year. Employees on the plan are not <u>eligible to carry over unused sick leave to a new fiscal year. The leave of service The amount of <u>sick leave allotted</u> will be determined <u>as howby the number of many-years of service</u> as a VRS Hybrid eligible employee, as of July 1 of that <u>fiscal year</u>. The amount of annual sick leave <u>received-allotted</u> is as follows:</u>

2. Permanent Part-time employees working at least 30 hours per week, but less than 40 shall receive 75% of the Full-time allotted lump sum.

2.13.3. Court Leave

-(BOS adopted - November 16, 2016)

Employees of the Sheriff's Office will operate under the Sheriff's policy regarding Court Leave in lieu of this section.

- A. An employee's absence from work for jury duty or for attending court in a non-official capacity as a witness shall be defined as "court leave". –Only leave-eligible employees are eligible for court leave.
- B. Court leave shall be granted by the County Administrator or Constitutional Officers for their respective employees. Before this court leave is granted, the employee must submit a copy of the official summons for jury duty or witness service to the County Administrator or Constitutional Officer prior to the beginning date of such service. Any employee appearing in court either as a defendant or plaintiff in a case shall not be eligible for this leave.
- C. A regular leave-eligible employee shall be <u>given-granted</u> time off without charge to other leave <u>balances</u> or <u>a</u> decrease <u>of in</u> pay while performing jury duty, <u>or</u> when subpoenaed as a witness on <u>County business behalf of the County</u>, or in a proceeding in which the employee is not a party. The period of <u>such-granted</u> leave shall be only as necessary for the <u>performance of the activity court appearance</u>, plus the necessary travel time.
- **2.13.4.** <u>Military Leave</u>. The following policy is intended to conform to state and federal law with respect to military leave for County employees. In the event that there is any dispute, ambiguity or misunderstanding as to the County's policy with respect to military leave, this policy shall be so construed as to conform to the federal Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (URESSA) and other applicable federal or state laws.
- A. Reserve Duty. Upon presentation of a copy of final orders or other equivalent notice, a regular employee who is a member of an officially-recognized reserve or National Guard unit is eligible to 15 work days of military leave for training purposes or active duty per federal fiscal year (October 1 September 30). During this 15-day period, the employee shall be considered on military leave with pay and shall accordingly be paid his or her full gross salary for regularly scheduled work hours during this period. Military leave will be credited to a full time employee on the basis of an 8-hour workday. A full-time employee working a 40 hour work week will necrue be allotted 120 hours (15 days x 8 hours) of military leave in a fiscal year. Military leave will be prorated for part-time employees and for employees on uncommon tours of duty based upon the "workday formula" as defined under Section 44-93 of the Code of Virginia. Based on

formulas in the Code of Virginia as well as the US Office of Personnel Management, Sheriff's Deputies working an 84 hour bi-weekly schedule will accrue be allotted 126 hours (84/80=1.05x120=126 or 1/260 x 2184=8.4x15=126) of military leave per federal fiscal year.

- B. <u>Active Duty</u>. Employees who voluntarily enlist in the Uniformed Services of the United States, or a reservist called to active duty, shall be placed on leave without pay for up to five (5) years while serving in the uniformed services. The leave without pay shall commence after the 15-day military leave with pay has been utilized.
- C. <u>Procedures for Military Leave</u>. An employee who is leaving to perform military service shall provide advanced written notice to his <u>or her</u> supervisor, which includes the best approximation of the expected dates of the leave. When available, employees shall provide a copy of their military orders. As with all leave requests, the employee should give as much advance notice as possible.

D. Benefits

- 1. During military leave with pay, the employee will continue to accrue seniority VRS service time, annual leave, and sick leave. Employees who are on military leave without pay will continue to accrue seniority VRS service time, but not annual leave or sick leave.
- 2. Employees reemployed following military leave will receive seniority and other benefits determined by seniority service time that the employee had at the beginning of military leave, plus any additional seniority and benefits the employee would have attained had the individual remained continuously employed. An employee's time spent on active military duty will be counted toward their eligibility for FMLA leave once they return to their job.
- 3. During a military leave of less than 31 days, an employee is entitled to continued group health plan coverage under the same conditions as if the employee had continued to work. For military leaves of more than 30 days, an employee and covered dependents may elect to continue his/her health coverage for up to 24 months at the cost of 102% of the overall (both employer and employee) premium rate. This continuation of coverage will run concurrently withserves as applicable health insurance coverage under COBRA.
- E. <u>Reemployment</u>. Any employee whose absence from employment with the County is necessitated by reason of military service in the uniformed services shall be entitled to all reemployment rights and benefits as set forth in the federal Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (URESSA) and other applicable federal or state laws.
- F. <u>Notice</u>. Upon return from military service, an employee must provide notice of or submit an application for reemployment in accordance with the following schedule:
- 1. An employee who served for less than 31 days, must report for reemployment at the beginning of the first full regularly scheduled working period on the first calendarwork day following completion of service and eight hours after returning to the employee's residence.

- 2. An employee who served for more than 30 days, but less than 181 days, must submit an application for reemployment no later than 14 days after completing his/her period of service, or, if this deadline is impossible or unreasonable through no fault of the employee, then on the next calendar day when submission becomes possible.
- 3. An employee who served for more than 180 days must submit an application for reemployment no later than 90 days after the completion of the uniformed service.
- 4. An employee who has been hospitalized or is recovering from an injury of illness incurred or aggravated while serving must submit an application for reemployment with Human Resources no later than two years following completion of service.

G. Terms

- 1. An employee will be reinstated to employment in the following manner depending upon the employee's period of military service:
- a. If less than 91 days of military service, employee will return to in-a position in which the employee had been employed prior to military service or a position that the employee would have attained if employment had not been interrupted by military service.
- b. If more than 90 days and less than 5 years of military service, then an employee will return to in a position that the employee would have attained if employment had not been interrupted by military service or a position of like seniority, status and pay.
- 2. A probationary employee called to military service is eligible for reemployment. When a probationary employee is reemployed, he or she will return to the same status as existed prior to the military service.
- H. Exceptions to Reemployment. In addition to the employee's failure to apply for reemployment in a timely manner, an employee is not entitled to reinstatement as described above if any of the following conditions exist:
- 1. The County's circumstances have so changed as to make reemployment impossible or unreasonable.
- 2. The employee's employment prior to the military service was merely for a brief, non-recurrent period of time and there was no reasonable expectation that the employment would have continued indefinitely or for a significant period.
 - 3. The employee did not receive an honorable discharge from military service.

2.13.5. Absence Without Leave.

A. Absence without leave shall be defined as an absence from the job during a scheduled work period without approval of the employee's supervisor or department headenough appropriate leave to cover the absence. Also, the failure to report to work at the expiration of an authorized leave or to request an extension of time, shall be considered an absence without leave. An unauthorized absence from duty during required hours of attendance shall be treated as an absence without pay. Where there are not adequate reasons for the failure to secure authorization prior to the absence the employee shall be subject to disciplinary action as may be determined by the department head subject to the provisions governing discipline set forth hereinup to and including termination of employment.

B. The following disciplinary procedure shall serve as a guide:

- 1. The first occurrence (2 work days or less) of absence without leave shall result in at least a reprimand with a copy to the official personnel file.
 - 2. The second occurrence (2 work days or less) of absence without leave within a
 - 3. 12-month period shall result in at least suspension without pay.
- 4. The third occurrence (2 work days or less) of absence without leave within a 12 month period shall result in the immediate dismissal of the employee.
- 5. Any employee absent without leave for three consecutive work days shall be subject to immediate dismissal.

2.13.6. Leave Without Pay

A. Policy

- 1. Leave of absence without pay may be granted for:
 - a. Educational leave in excess of such leave allowable with pay;
 - b. Courses of studyFamily Medical Leave Act (FMLA);
 - c. Military leave in excess of such leave allowable with pay;
- d. Use of annual and sick leave which exceeds the amount of leave earned requires specific advance approval of the County Administrator, or the Constitutional Officer for their respective employees.
- 2. Leave of absence without pay shall not be allowed until all balances of applicable leave with pay have been used. Except for FMLA, a IL-eave of absence without pay shall not be granted for more than one calendar month without approval of the County Administrator or Constitutional Officers for their respective employees.

- 3. Any employee returning from leave of absence without pay, during or at the end of the period for which the leave was granted, shall be entitled to reinstatement. If he/she fails to return at the end of the period for which the leave was granted, he/she shall be treated as having resigned.
- B. <u>Leave Accrual</u>. During the period for which the leave was granted, employees will not accrue annual or sick leave hours.

C. Benefits

- 1. The County will continue to pay the life insurance premiums.
- 2. Retirement Contributions –
- a. Retirement contributions (including the component to fund the health credit) will be made for any period in which the employee has received qualifying compensation.
- b. Retirement contributions will not be made for any pay period in which no qualifying compensation has been received by the employee (i.e., if the employee was on leave without pay for the entire pay period).
- D. <u>Health Insurance Premiums</u>. For an employee granted leave without pay status under the Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA), the County will continue to pay the employer portion of the premium. For an employee granted leave without pay status who does not qualify for FMLA, the employee will have to pay both the employer and employee portions of the premium in order to maintain coverage.
- 2.13.7. <u>Educational Leave</u>. Employees may be allowed to take leave to further their education through courses related to their work. This leave may be with full, partial, or no pay, and must be authorized by the County Administrator, or Constitutional Officers for their respective employees, who decides what type of leave employees may take. <u>Financial assistance for such courses may be available from the employees department, based on the department's needs and ability to finance educational courses.</u>

2.13.8. Closures Due To Weather or Other Emergencies

- A. <u>Purpose</u>. To prescribe uniform procedures for the closure of County offices and the treatment of employee work and absences from work during periods of inclement weather and other emergency closures.
- B. <u>Policy</u>. Fluvanna County will make every reasonable effort to open its facilities to the public as scheduled, consistent with safe access for staff and the public. Whenever it is determined that the health and safety of citizens or employees would be placed at risk or that conditions or events prevent performance of regular operations, services, or responsibilities assigned, closure of County offices or specific departments may be deemed necessary.

- 1. The County Administrator is responsible for determining whether a delayed opening, early closure, or full day closing of the County offices is necessary due to inclement weather or other emergency.
- 2. The chief judge or presiding judge of the respective court may authorize the clerk of the court to close the clerk's office and court. The clerk of the respective court will notify the County Administrator or designee of such closure.

C. Employee Safety

- 1. Employees should use their own judgment when they believe roads or other conditions may be unsafe for travel to/from work, and employees may take appropriate annual leave when necessary during inclement weather or emergency situations. Employees are encouraged to maintain adequate leave balances for such situations.
- 3. During times of emergency or inclement weather it is the responsibility of the employee to confirm when and where County facilities will be closed. Employees are advised to listen to local radio/TV announcements for closures/reopening notices. If such conditions develop during the night and warrant delayed opening or official closing, employees will be notified through their department via the Emergency Contact and Recall List. If there is any doubt, employees should contact their supervisor.

D. Definitions

- 1. <u>Essential Employees</u>. Essential employees are those who may be required to work during emergency conditions as designated by their department head.
- 2. <u>Public Safety Personnel</u>. Deputy Sheriff's and Emergency Communications Officers are deemed Public Safety Personnel.

3. Closure Pay

- a. A supplemental pay category for leave-eligible employees paid at an employee's annualized normal hourly rate during an officially approved closure.
- b. Closure pay can only be earned during an employee's regularly scheduled work hours.

E. <u>Designated Essential Employees During Approved Closures</u>

- 1. Essential employees who physically work some or all of their regularly scheduled hours during an approved closure will receive their normal compensation for those regular hours worked **plus** closure pay for those same hours (i.e., "double time pay").
- 2. Overtime policy also applies to essential personnel who physically work more than 40 hours during that work week (Sun to Sat).

3. Overtime is only calculated on the regular and unscheduled hours worked, not the closure pay compensation amounts.

F. Public Safety Personnel During Approved Closures

- 1. Will physically work their regularly scheduled hours regardless of County office closures and may also be required to work over regularly scheduled hours to meet operational needs.
- 2. Public Safety personnel who physically work their regularly scheduled hours during an approved County closure will receive their normal compensation for those regular hours worked **plus** closure pay for those same hours (i.e., "double time pay").
- 3. Overtime policy also applies to a Deputy Sheriff who physically works over 86 hours in their work cycle and to an Emergency Communications Officer who physically works over 40 hours during their work week (Sun to Sat).
- 4. Overtime is only calculated on the regular and unscheduled hours worked, not the closure pay compensation amounts.

G. Non-Essential Employees During Approved Closures

- 1. Employees will not be required to make up regularly scheduled time missed during an approved closure. Such time will be charged to the closure pay code.
- 2. Regularly scheduled hours missed outside of the approved closure hours will be charged to accrued annual leave or accrued compensatory time.
- 3. Leave-eligible employees who are not regularly scheduled to work during an approved closure will not receive closure pay.
- 4. Employees on official travel out of the local area and not subject to the weather or emergency event will not receive closure pay.
 - 5. Employees on pre-approved leave will not receive closure pay.
- 6. Non-essential employees who work some or all of their regularly scheduled hours during an approved closure will not receive closure pay.

2.13.9. <u>Leave Sharing</u>

A. <u>Requirements</u>. Leave may be donated from one employee to another under the following conditions:

- 1. Employee receiving the leave uses it for authorized sick leave purposes only; and,
- 2. Employee receiving the leave has exhausted all other leave balances (including annual, sick, and compensatory leave); and,
- 3. Employee donating the leave understands that there is no obligation or pressure to donate leave.
- B. Requesting and Donating Leave. If an employee(s) have freely agreed to donate leave to another employee needing sick leave and meeting the conditions outlined in this policy, notification must be made to the Finance Director in writing. The following items must appear in that notice:
- 1. All parties must acknowledge that they meet all of the conditions as set forth in this policy.
- 2. Each donor shall indicate the type of leave he/she is donating and how many hours are being donated.
 - 3. This letter shall be signed by both the requestor and the donor(s).
- C. Should a requestor receive leave from more than one donor and not use all of the leave, the amount of donated leave remaining shall be divided equally among the donors and returned to them as the same type of leave that they donated.

2.13.10. Bereavement Leave

BOS adopted – January 21, 2015

A. <u>Policy</u>. Bereavement leave is designed to provide employees with paid time away from work to grieve and to handle matters related to a death in their immediate family. All Regular full time staff are eligible for paid leave upon the death of an immediate family member. Regular part time staff will be compensated for regularly scheduled work hours only on the approved Bereavement Leave days.

B. Immediate Family Defined

- Spouse
- Child (natural/step/adopted/foster)
- Parent (natural/step/adoptive)
- Sibling (natural/step/adopted)
- Immediate in-laws (father, mother, sister, brother, son, daughter)
- Grandparents (immediate or spousal)
- Legal Guardian
- Person living in the same household as the employee.

- C. Other relationships may also be approved on a case-by-case basis by the County Administrator or Constitutional Officer without setting precedent.
- D. <u>Length of Leave</u>. Bereavement Leave is granted for up to three days. If additional time is necessary, the employee may elect to use other available leave with the approval of his/her supervisor.

E. Notification

- 1. Employees taking Bereavement Leave will notify their supervisor as soon as possible of the funeral arrangements, anticipated length of leave, where the employee can be reached during the Leave, and other appropriate information. In no case will Bereavement Leave begin before the Supervisor is notified.
- 2. If the employee requires more than 3 days leave in the event of a death in the immediate family, vacation, personal, comp, sick, or leave without pay may be requested for the additional days.
- 3. An employee may request leave for the death of a non-immediate family member or a friend. In this case, vacation, personal, comp or leave without pay may be requested.

As you follow the needs of our community, housing has been a prominent topic. In 2018, a Housing Needs Assessment identified that the City of Charlottesville's affordable housing needs totaled 3,318 units, to include: the number of cost-burdened renters spending more than 30 percent of their income on housing, replacement of existing assisted housing units in poor condition, and housing needs to accommodate homeless individuals with families. Preliminary reports indicate that the affordable housing needs for the region are upwards of 11,820 units. This number is expected to be closer to 14,500 by the year 2040. The need for housing is a universal issue.

To begin to address housing needs through a regional lens, the Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commissioners approved at their September meeting an Operational Framework to create a Regional Housing Partnership (RHP). The RHP is an advisory board that generates research on housing-related issues and makes recommendations to localities. The RHP consists of 20 voting members from the public, private, nonprofit, and citizen sectors. They will address, through advisement, the housing needs of the Thomas Jefferson Planning District's region, with a focus on housing production, diversity, accessibility, cost, location, design, and increasing stability for the region's residents. Support for the creation of a Regional Housing partnership has been extremely favorable.

On April 19, 2019, the RHP is planning to host a Spring Regional Housing Summit at the Omni Hotel in Charlottesville, VA. The goals of the summit are to 1) better inform all stakeholders of the regional impacts of housing, and 2) help direct the RHP to develop a Regional Housing Strategy to improve all housing needs, including: homeless, affordable and market rate. The summit will host 150-200 attendees from throughout the region. We are seeking sponsors to help us raise \$20,000 to host the summit. COUNTY OF FLUVANNA EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 1st day of March, 2019, by and between the Board of Supervisors of Fluvanna County, Virginia, ("Employer"), party of the first part, and ERIC M. DAHL ("Employee"), party of the second part:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Employer desires to employ ERIC M. DAHL as County Administrator of Fluvanna County, Virginia under the terms and conditions provided for in Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, and this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Employer wishes to provide certain benefits and certain conditions of employment in order to:

- A. Secure and retain the services of Employee and to provide inducement for him to remain in such employment;
- B. Make possible full work productivity by assuring Employee's morale and peace of mind with respect to future security; and
- C. Provide a just means for terminating Employee's services at such time as he may be unable to fully discharge his duties or when Employer may otherwise desire to terminate his employ; and
- D. Provide for a just notification and/or compensation to the Employer if the Employee voluntarily resigns for other employment elsewhere.

WHEREAS, Employee desires to be the County Administrator of Fluvanna County and accepts all duties and responsibilities of such position as provided by law and pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1: DUTIES

Employer hereby agrees to employ ERIC M. DAHL as County Administrator of Fluvanna County, Virginia, to perform the functions and duties specified in Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, and to perform other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the Employer shall from time to time assign.

Employee agrees to serve as County Administrator of Fluvanna County, Virginia and to perform the functions and duties specified in Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, and to perform other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the Employer shall from time to time assign. The Employee shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the County

of Fluvanna and responsible to the Employer for the proper administration of the affairs of the County. The Employee shall be in charge of all employees of the Employer. The Employee shall conduct himself in compliance with all provisions of state and federal law and all ethical considerations, including the International City/County Management Association Code of Ethics.

SECTION 2: TERM

Unless terminated earlier as provided herein, the term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years commencing July 6, 2019, (the "Effective Date") and shall be automatically renewed thereafter in accordance with the provisions for reappointment contained in Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, on the same terms and conditions for successive three-year terms; provided that there shall be no automatic renewal of the terms hereof if the Employer shall notify the Employee of its intent not to renew the same by writing delivered to the Employee not less than 6 months prior to the expiration of the original or any successor term. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the Employer from terminating the Employee at any time, with or without cause subject only to section 16 of this agreement. The Employee serves at the pleasure of the Employer. It is expressly understood and agreed that nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the rights of the Employer or the Employee to terminate this Agreement in accordance with the provisions of Section 16 of this Agreement.

SECTION 3: COMPENSATION

For his services as County Administrator, Employer agrees to pay the Employee effective July 6, 2019, an annual base salary, exclusive of benefits, of \$110,000 payable in installments as paid to other County employees, each such periodic payment to be as nearly equal as possible. The salary shall be subject to payroll deduction required by law or requested by Employee and determined to be available and proper.

In addition, Employer agrees to increase said base salary and/or other benefits of Employee in such amounts and to such extent as the Employer may determine desirable or appropriate based upon the performance evaluation process described in Section 4 of this Agreement, provided however, that when said consideration and salary adjustment is given, it shall not be less than any cost of living annual increase(s) determined for other employees of the County.

SECTION 4: PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

The Board of Supervisors shall review and evaluate the performance of the Employee in July in each succeeding year (the "Anniversary Date"). Said review and evaluation shall be in accordance with specific criteria developed jointly by the Employer and Employee. Said criteria may be added to or deleted from as the Board of Supervisors may from time to time determine, in consultation with the Employee. Furthermore, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors shall provide the Employee with a written summary statement of the findings of the Board of Supervisors and an adequate opportunity for the Employee to discuss his evaluation with the Board of Supervisors shall be provided.

Annually, the Board of Supervisors and the Employee shall define such goals and objectives as they deem necessary for the proper operation of the County and in the attainment of the Board's policy objectives and shall further establish a relative priority amongst these goals and

objectives, said goals and objectives to be reduced to writing. As a part of the evaluation of the Employee, the Board of Supervisors shall consider the Employee's performance in working toward the attainment of these goals, objectives and priorities. These goals and objectives shall be generally attainable within the time limitations as specified and the annual operating and capital budgets and appropriations provided.

The performance evaluation as aforementioned will be used by the Employer in its discretion to determine whether or not the Employee is eligible for the annual base salary increases as provided in Section 3. The Employer may, by action taken at any meeting prior to the Anniversary Date, in its sole discretion, withhold or delay the base salary increases, wholly or in part, as it may determine to be appropriate based on Employee's performance evaluation.

SECTION 5: BENEFITS

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, Employee shall be entitled to the same fringe and other benefits provided other full time Employees of the Employer.

SECTION 6: ANNUAL LEAVE & SICK LEAVE

The Employee shall be entitled to leave in accordance with the provisions of the County's personnel policy for employees of the Employer with 15 years of tenure, with the employer or the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) as the same shall be amended from time to time; provided that Employee's right to take leave shall be done in a manner consistent with the exercise of his duties and shall be subject to the approval of the Employer, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The Employer shall grant an annual leave Service Accumulation of 260 hours for the Employee.

SECTION 7: INSURANCE, RETIREMENT

Employee shall be a participant in the Virginia Retirement System in accordance with State law.

Employer shall provide Employee with and pay the amount determined for other employees of the County for individual health, dental, and vision insurance if provided to other County employees. The Employee may purchase additional family coverage at his expense.

SECTION 8: HOURS OF WORK

The Employee, as County Administrator, is an exempt employee, who is expected to engage in those hours of work, which are necessary to fulfill the obligation of his position of employment. It is recognized that the Employee must devote a great deal of time outside the normal office hours to the business of the Employer. To that end, the Employee will be allowed to take time off, as he shall deem appropriate, during said normal office hours; provided that Employee's right to take leave shall be done in a manner consistent with the exercise of his duties and shall be subject to the approval of the Employer, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

SECTION 9: AUTOMOBILE & COMMUNICATION ALLOWANCE

The Employee shall use his personal vehicle for County business during and while off scheduled working hours. The Employer shall provide \$400 in monthly payment to compensate for mileage and other expenses such as insurance and related vehicle expenses. The County will provide a cellular telephone for Employee's use for official business. Additionally, the Employee may provide his own communication equipment such as home computer and home phone systems to be used to conduct and be of service for County business. The Employer shall provide a \$50 monthly allowance for this expense. These amounts will be paid in the regular County installment.

SECTION 10: RESIDENCE

Employee agrees that he shall maintain his residence in the County of Fluvanna, Virginia, throughout his employment tenure with Employer.

SECTION 11: DUES AND SUBSCRIPTION

Employer agrees to budget and pay for the professional dues and subscriptions of Employee necessary for his full participation in the Virginia Local Government Management Association and other related professional associations; provided that all such memberships, as well as the expenses provided for in Sections 12 and 13 hereinafter, shall be subject to the reasonable approval of the Employer.

SECTION 12: PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Professional Association Memberships: Employer shall pay with the approved budget costs associated with the professional dues and subscriptions of the Employee necessary for continuation and full participation in national, regional, state, and local associations, and organizations necessary and desirable for the Employee's continued professional participation, growth, and advancement, and for the good of the Employer.

Conference Expenses: Expenses incurred by Employee during his attendance at conferences, legislative hearings, or similar events or meetings shall be paid by the Employer in accordance with County policy and within the approved budget.

Additional Professional Education: Employer shall pay tuition and other related expenses for additional education which Employer shall deem reasonably necessary for Employee's employment, within the amount budgeted therefor and as approved annually in advance by the board of supervisors. All such expenses shall be repaid by Employee upon the termination of his employment under this agreement or any extension hereof, together with interest at the legal rate; provided, however, that if Employee successfully completes such education, his obligation for repayment shall be reduced by 25% for each year he shall continue in the County's employ after the completion of such education.

SECTION 13: BUSINESS EXPENSES

Actual and necessary expenses incurred by Employee in the discharge of official duties or in the performance of functions authorized by the Employer shall be reimbursed upon submission

of receipts and reports of expenditures. Civic club dues for organizations serving Fluvanna County shall be considered as eligible Business Expenses.

SECTION 14: BONDING

Employer shall bear the full cost of any fidelity or other bonds required of the Employee under any law or ordinance.

SECTION 15: OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Employer, in consultation with Employee, shall fix any other terms and conditions of employment relating to the performance of Employee as it may determine reasonable from time to time, provided such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with or in conflict with the provisions of this Agreement, or any applicable law.

SECTION 16: TERMINATION

- A. Employee's employment may be terminated, either with or without cause, by a vote of a majority of the Board of Supervisors at a regular or special meeting
- B. In the event the Employee voluntarily resigns his position with the Employer, the Employee shall give the Employer sixty (60) days notice in advance, unless the parties otherwise agree.
- C. In the event the Employee is terminated without cause, the employee shall be entitled to severance pay equal to three (3) month's salary, not including allowances for the term of this contract. Severance shall include accrued annual and sick leave, up to the maximum provided by the general employee policies of the County as the same may be amended from time to time.
- D. Employee's employment may be terminated for cause for any substantial and material breach of the terms of this agreement, including, but not limited to, use of intoxicants while on duty; serious neglect of duty, insubordination, incompetence or inefficiency in the performance of required job duties; use of offensive, abusive, threatening, coercive, indecent or discourteous language toward supervisors, other employees, or members of the public; intentional falsification of personnel records, time records, or any other County records or reports; substantial and intentional violation of any County policies including, but not limited to, sexual harassment; conviction of a felony, a crime involving moral turpitude or other crime adversely reflecting on Employee's fitness for his employment; and dishonesty in any form, including falsification of one's employment application or history. The Employer shall provide the Employee written notice of termination, including the reasons therefor, and shall provide Employee a reasonable opportunity to be heard with respect to such termination.

SECTION 17: DISABILITY

If the Employee is permanently disabled or is otherwise unable to perform his duties

because of sickness, accident, injury, mental incapacity or health for a period of more than four (4) weeks beyond any accrued sick leave, Employer shall have the option to terminate the Employee, and not-withstanding the Employee's inability to perform, the Employee will receive severance pay in accordance with Section 16C of this agreement.

SECTION 18: INDEMNIFICATION

Employer, or its insurance carrier, shall defend and provide legal representation for Employee for any and all claims, proceedings or lawsuits, whether groundless or otherwise, related to or arising out of Employee's employment with Employer in accordance with Virginia Code Sections 15.2-1521 and -1522.

SECTION 19: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- The text herein shall constitute the entire Agreement between the parties.
- В. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs of Employee. This Agreement is not assignable by the Employee.
- This Agreement shall become effective commencing on the Effective Date.
- D. If any provision, or any portion thereof, contained in this Agreement is held unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or portion thereof, shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.
- This Agreement shall be construed and governed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Board of Supervisors of Fluvanna County, Virginia has caused this Agreement to be signed and executed on its behalf by its Chairman and duly attested by the Board's Clerk, and the Employee has signed and executed this Agreement, both in duplicate, the day and year first above written, having approved the same and authorizing this agreement and execution by resolution of the Board of Supervisors, duly adopted.

Whereas the Agreement is for a term of one-year beginning on the date the County executed the Agreement, and subject to (4) additional one-year renewals by the County pursuant to the Agreement;

Whereas the Consultant submitted a Proposal for "Materials Testing and Special Inspections Services Zion Crossroads Water Booster Pump Station and Wastewater Pump Station Proposal No.: P19020200-010202" dated February 26, 2019, ("the Proposal") which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by reference herein as a material part of this Project Agreement;

Whereas, the County desires that the Consultant complete all those services listed in the Proposal, including without limitation, Field Observation and Testing, and Project Management & Administration Services, as detailed therein (collectively the "Services") and

Whereas, the Consultant desires to accept the work and complete the Services and all work necessary and related thereto (collectively the "Task Order").

For good and valuable consideration, the parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I: THE AGREEMENT

The foregoing recitations are incorporated by reference into this Project Agreement.

This Project Agreement is an addendum to and made a material part of the Agreement. The parties hereto agree that except as specifically and expressly modified hereby that Agreement remains in full force and effect and the provisions of the Agreement are incorporated herein and are a material part hereof.

ARTICLE III: EXHIBITS AND RESOLVING CONFLICTS

The rights and duties of the County and Consultant applicable to the County's projects under this Project Agreement are set forth in the following Agreement Documents:

- (i) This Project Agreement;
- (ii) Exhibit 1 hereto;
- (iii) The Agreement including exhibits thereto.

Whenever possible, the terms of the above Agreement Documents shall be read together, however in the event of a conflict, the order of preference above shall govern which Agreement Document will control. In other words, (i) shall control over (ii) to (iii) above, and (ii) shall control over (iii).

ARTICLE IV: FEES

The Consultant will receive up to a maximum of the not-to-exceed fees below:

A. For the Services described as Field Observation and Testing\$20,874.00; and

B. For the Services described as Project Management & Administration Services.... \$3,913.00; based on actual time worked and materials; which shall be payable by the County, no more than monthly, and upon proper invoice by the Consultant as described herein. The invoice shall describe the services rendered in the invoice with specificity. The Consultant will be paid within forty-five (45) days of receipt of a valid invoice following final acceptance of all work by the County of Fluvanna." No invoice may be provided by the Consultant to the County until the items or services purchased have been delivered to, inspected by and accepted by the County. In no event shall the fees due under this Project Agreement exceed \$24,787.00 for all Services and the Consultant agrees to complete all work on the Task Order for such not to exceed total even if the time and materials totals exceeds such amount.

The not to exceed fee includes all fees, costs and charges of any kind to perform all the services and work, including supplying at its own cost and expense any necessary tools, equipment or materials, necessary or desirable for completion of the task specified.

The not-to-exceed fees indicated above and on Exhibit 1 attached hereto are all based on those rates as set forth on the Project Unit Rates portion of Exhibit 1. Notwithstanding that, the actual hourly

fees charged by the Contactor for the Services will be based on the rates set forth on Exhibit 1 and will vary based upon the person completing the Services (for example, \$60 per hour for "Clerical", etc.). On behalf of Draper Aden Associates, thank you for the opportunity to present our proposal to Fluvanna County (the County) for professional services for the development of a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) to include street, water and sewer improvements for the proposed Fluvanna Senior Affordable Housing at Village Oaks project.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Fluvanna County has identified the need for affordable housing and, in partnership with the Piedmont Housing Alliance (PHA), is seeking to develop a senior affordable housing community in the Village Oaks subdivision neighboring Lake Monticello's main entrance. The County and Piedmont Housing Alliance have developed a Preliminary Architectural Report (PAR) plans and have selected an approximately 3.36 acre site for the proposed housing development; refer to attachment.

The County is seeking the services of an engineering firm to develop a PER that includes a comprehensive site plan and mapping that identifies needed site improvements and provides a corresponding cost estimate.

The PER and related cost estimates are essential elements to the County's and PHA's goal of completing planning grant activities and submitting a grant application to the VA Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding in March of 2019.

Draper Aden Associates is pleased to present the following for your review and approval.

II. SCOPE OF SERVCES

A. Preliminary Engineering Report

- 1. Base Map: Draper Aden Associates will create a compiled base map for the project area using readily available GIS information received from the County, AquaVirginia, and/or the PAR. Mapping will include existing improvements including off-site water and sewer lines, entrances and other existing features.
- 2. Preliminary Design: Based on the layout shown in the preliminary architectural report, we will prepare a preliminary site plan showing the proposed locations of the new building, parking areas, walkways, grading/drainage, on-site water and sewer utility systems, stormwater management areas, and landscaping. The preliminary site layout plan will provide sufficient information to develop an opinion of probable construction cost for the site improvements and generally depict the proposed site development.

B. Environmental Review

In an effort to facilitate the PER phase of work, we propose to complete a desktop environmental review to include the items listed below in order to identify any environmental concerns at the proposed site that might affect project development.

 Preliminary Cultural Resources Assessment (Desktop level review of publicly available information, no regulatory coordination)

- Preliminary T&E Species Review (Desktop level review of publicly available information, no regulatory coordination)
- Desktop review and site reconnaissance to identify potential streams and wetlands (Excludes formal delineation and/or jurisdictional confirmation)
- Screening level review for readily identifiable impacts (i.e., hazardous materials, petroleum) onsite or in the near vicinity (Does not constitute a full ASTM-1527E-13 Phase I Environmental Site Assessment)

Based on the information available and presented in the CDBG Manual, future phases of this project might require a more thorough environmental review to meet grant requirements. Specifically, since the project includes new construction, an environmental assessment based on the procedures outlined in Appendix 2 of the CDBG Manual may be required. This includes review of floodplain and wetland components, review of historic resources under Section 106, review of threatened and endangered species, consideration of potential contamination and toxic substances, and other factors (see Appendix 2.Q) as well as coordination with regulatory agencies and required notifications and public comment periods to complete the Environmental Review Record. 
