#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

I pledge allegiance, to the flag, of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

#### **GENERAL RULES OF ORDER**

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to maintain order and decorum at meetings. The Chairman shall speak to points of order in preference to all other members.
- 2. In maintaining decorum and propriety of conduct, the Chairman shall not be challenged and no debate shall be allowed until after the Chairman declares that order has been restored. In the event the Board wishes to debate the matter of the disorder or the bringing of order; the regular business may be suspended by vote of the Board to discuss the matter.
- 3. No member or citizen shall be allowed to use defamatory or abusive language directed at any member of the Board or other person, to create excessive noise, or in any way incite persons to use such tactics. The Chair shall be the judge of such breaches, however, the Board may by majority vote of the Board members present and voting to overrule the judgment of the Chair.
- 4. When a person engages in such breaches, the Chairman shall order the person's removal from the building, or may order the person to stand silent, or may, if necessary, order the person removed from the County property.

#### **RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS**

#### 1. PURPOSE

- The purpose of a public hearing is to receive testimony from the public on certain resolutions, ordinances or amendments prior to taking action.
- A hearing is not a dialogue or debate. Its express purpose is to receive additional facts, comments and opinion on subject items.

#### 2. SPEAKERS

- Speakers should approach the lectern so they may be visible and audible to the Board.
- Each speaker should clearly state his/her name and address.
- All comments should be directed to the Board.
- All questions should be directed to the Chairman. Members of the Board are not expected to respond to questions, and response to questions shall be made at the Chairman's discretion.
- Speakers are encouraged to contact staff regarding unresolved concerns or to receive additional information.
- Speakers with questions are encouraged to call County staff prior to the public hearing.
- Speakers should be brief and avoid repetition of previously presented comments.

#### 3. ACTION

- At the conclusion of the public hearing on each item, the Chairman will close the public hearing.
- The Board will proceed with its deliberation and will act on or formally postpone action on such item prior to proceeding to other agenda items.
- Further public comment after the public hearing has been closed generally will not be permitted.

DISCUSSION:	This ordinance permits deputy sheriffs to apply to the Sheriff for approval to work off-duty. The Sheriff will have the authority to approve or deny the request, and may create reasonable rules, regulations and conditions for working off-duty. Deputies will only perform security, traffic-control, and other law enforcement functions. An application process and employment agreement will ensure the off-duty work does not interfere with a deputy's duties to the County or ability to respond to an emergency. The private employer will be required to demonstrate that they are appropriately insured and add the County and Sheriff's Office to their policy.							
FISCAL IMPACT:	Advertisement to occur June 24, 2021 and July 1, 2021.  The proposed hourly rate for off-duty employment by deputy sheriffs is \$45.00 per hour; \$40.00 is to compensate the deputy, and \$5.00 of the rate is to compensate the Sheriff's Office and covers administrative expenses associated with the program.

## AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 8 OF THE COUNTY CODE BY ADDING SECTION 8-7 TO PERMIT DEPUTY SHERIFFS, WITH THE APPROVAL OF AND SUBJECT TO THE RULES OF THE SHERIFF, TO ENGAGE IN OFF-DUTY EMPLOYMENT AT PRIVATE EVENTS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FLUVANNA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the County Code be, and it is hereby, amended in Chapter 8, by adding Section 8-7, as follows:

#### Sec. 8-7. Employment of off-duty deputy sheriffs.

Upon individual application to and approval by the Sheriff, deputy sheriffs may engage in off-duty employment, including employment which may occasionally require such deputies to use their police powers in the performance of such employment, subject to such rules, regulations and conditions applying to such off-duty employment as the Sheriff may prescribe.

# CHARTER COLUMBIA AREA RENEWAL EFFORT (CARE) TASK FORCE

Approved By BOS:

July 5, 2017

**1.** <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of the Columbia Area Renewal Effort (CARE) Task Force is to advise, assist, support, and advocate for positive change and renewal efforts in the Columbia area. The Task Force will prepare a report of proposed actions for consideration by the Board of Supervisors.



- **2.** <u>Task Force Duration</u>. The work of the Task Force is intended to be completed and a final report of recommendations submitted to the Board of Supervisors by December 31, 2017, unless an extension is approved by the Board.
- **3.** <u>Tasks / Responsibilities</u>. In collaboration with County staff and other local agencies, the Task Force shall develop a list of proposed action steps to:
  - a. Promote citizen engagement.
  - b. Support renewal and clean-up efforts.
  - c. Identify and develop green space opportunities and options.
  - d. Advocate for improved public safety awareness and positive actions.
  - e. Protect and enhance unique historical/architectural resources.
  - f. Review and assess Historic District designation options.
  - g. Support business attraction.
  - h. Propose and support public events for the Columbia area.
- **4. Membership.** Membership shall be comprised as follows:
  - a. Columbia-area resident, business, and/or property owner members (8) (appointed by Board of Supervisors)
  - b. Columbia Interfaith Council representative
  - c. Fluvanna Historical Society Representative
  - d. Fluvanna County Columbia District Supervisor
  - e. Fluvanna County Sheriff (or representative)
  - f. Fluvanna County Administrator (or representative)
  - g. Fluvanna County Community & Economic Development representatives (2)

- h. Fluvanna County Public Works representative
- i. Fluvanna County Parks & Recreation representative
- j. The Chair may request other ad hoc members to participate in task force efforts, as needed. This will likely include subject matter experts and representatives from local support agencies.

#### 5. Organizational Structure

- a. Chair. The Task Force will be chaired by Board of Supervisors' representative (or designee).
- b. Meetings
  - (1) Public meetings are generally scheduled for the third Monday of each month at 7:00 pm.
- (2) Meetings will be advertised via the County website. Additional or special meetings may be called by the Chair with 72-hour notice to members and posting of the notification on the County website.
  - (3) A guorum shall consist of a simple majority of members.
- c. <u>Minutes</u>. Minutes of each meeting will be prepared by a designated County representative, and following adoption by the Task Force, shall be posted on the County website.
- d. <u>Recommendations and Reports</u>. Task Force reports and action recommendations will be submitted in writing to the County Administrator for consideration by the Board of Supervisors on a regular meeting agenda. Documentation will include background information and justification for any recommended actions.

#### 6. Parliamentary Authority

- a. The Task Force shall be governed in its proceedings by the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.
- b. Decisions will commonly be made by consensus. A formal vote shall be taken when a decision is required for policy recommendations and action items, or if the decision requires referral to the Board of Supervisors for formal approval.

The Code of Virginia (§ 24.2-108 and § 24.2-111) mandates the governing body of each county or city to pay compensation to their general registrar and electoral board members in accordance with the compensation expense plan established in the 2021 Virginia Acts of Assembly (Chapter 552). This correspondence sets the authorized state compensation to be paid to your general registrar and electoral board members effective July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 as shown in tables 1 and 2. The tables include the amount authorized for the period of March 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021 to help with your 2022 reimbursement request. The authorized salary rates for General Registrars and Electoral Boards were computed using the latest (Published January 29, 2021) population estimates from the University of Virginia's Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service, Demographics & Workforce.

#### **Important Note**

2021 Virginia Acts of Assembly Chapter 552 makes several major changes in the authorized state supported salary for General Registrars and members of local electoral boards, per the 2021 Appropriation Act.

#### **Compensation for General Registrar**

Table 1 sets forth the authorized salary rates for your local general registrar from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Your local governing body will be reimbursed by the Department of Elections for state authorized salary payments to the extent of funds provided in the 2021 Virginia Acts of Assembly (Chapter 552). The authorized salary takes into account changes made by the General Assembly and Governor to adjust General Registrar salaries to equal the salaries for Local Treasurers as established under Item 74 of the appropriation act which include population ranges. Table 1 shows only the annual salary as locality's process payrolls differently.

Your local governing body is also required to provide benefits to the general registrar, assistant registrars and the registrar's staff as provided to other employees of your locality. Local governments are also required to pay the reasonable expenses of the general registrar, including reimbursement for mileage at the rate payable to members of the General Assembly. Reasonable expenses include, but are not limited to, costs for: (i) an adequately trained registrar's staff, including training in the use of computers and technology to the extent provided to other local employees with similar job responsibilities, and reasonable costs for the

general registrar to attend annual training offered by the Department of Elections; (ii) adequate training for officers of election; (iii) conducting elections as required; and (iv) voter education. Local governing bodies may supplement the annual salary of the general registrar. However, the supplement, expenses, and mileage of the general registrar, are not reimbursable from the State Treasury.

#### **Electoral Board Authorized Compensation**

Table 2 shows the authorized state annual salary rates for your Electoral Board (EB) members. These amounts are to be paid by your local government during the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Also included in the table is the amount authorized for the period of March 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021 to help with your 2022 reimbursement request. As shown in table 2, the authorized salaries **include** a five-percent salary increase for fiscal year 2022 effective July 1, 2021.

#### Mileage & Expenses

The governing body of any county or city may pay the secretary of its electoral board additional allowance for expenses as it deems appropriate but there shall be no reimbursement out of the State Treasury for such expenses.

The authorized mileage rate for general registrars, their staff and local electoral board members is to be paid at the rate listed by the federal government at the IRS website (<a href="http://www.irs.gov/Tax-Professionals/Standard-Mileage-Rates/">http://www.irs.gov/Tax-Professionals/Standard-Mileage-Rates/</a>) at the time of travel, counties and cities shall not be reimbursed from State Treasury for mileage paid to general registrars or members of electoral boards.

#### **Reimbursements from State Treasury**

Annually, the Department of Elections reimburses your local government for the state authorized salaries based on population paid to the general registrar and your local electoral board members. As stated, the reimbursements will not include local supplements, mileage and expenses of the general registrar or local electoral board only the state authorized amount contingent to the extent of funds provided.

The Appropriations Act permits the governing body of any county or city to pay the secretary of its electoral board additional allowance for expenses as it deems appropriate. However, the Department of Elections will not reimburse the additional allowances.





The Planning Commission members and County Staff recommend Approval of the proposed Agricultural Enterprise (winery) use provided the impact upon the surrounding property owners is minimal. Staff has proposed recommended conditions to ensure that this use complies with all Federal, State and County Code requirements:

- 1. This Special Use Permit is granted for an Agricultural Enterprise (winery) use to Amy and Joshua Bower and is not transferable and it does not run with the land on Tax Map 48 Section 1 Parcel 3.
- 2. The applicants will provide staffing for private parking and traffic circulation purposes from Route 6 with event personnel clearly marked as "Event Staff" for safety reasons. The Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office shall be notified at least thirty (30) days prior to each Agricultural Enterprise (winery) event that is between 100 to 150 persons and is scheduled on the premises.
- 3. The Agricultural Enterprise (winery) and related winery or wedding reception events with outdoor live or recorded music shall be from 10:00 am until 11:00 pm, with the exception of 5K and 10K runs that may start at 7:00 am on the premises.
- 4. The applicants shall ensure compliance with the Noise Ordinance of the Code of the County of Fluvanna, as adopted and as enforced by the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office.
- 5. The site shall be maintained in a neat and orderly manner so that the visual appearance from the public right-of-way and adjacent properties is acceptable to County officials.
- 6. The Board of Supervisors, or its representative, reserves the right to inspect the property for compliance with these conditions at any time.
- 7. Under Section 22-17-4 F (2) of the Fluvanna County Code, the Board of Supervisors has the authority to revoke a Special Use Permit if the property owners have substantially breached the conditions of the Special Use Permit.






- 2. Pursuant to Section 19-6-6 of the Subdivision Ordinance, a bond shall be required with surety in an amount and form acceptable to the County Attorney, to insure that the proposed infrastructure improvements are all completed at the expense of the developer.
- For construction of the central sewer systems occurring adjacent to existing development, adequate
  dust and siltation control measures shall be taken to prevent adverse effects on the adjacent properties.
  All construction activity for the central utility systems shall occur between dawn and dusk, Monday
  through Friday.
- 4. The homeowners association or another owner of these utilities as approved by the State Corporation Commission shall be responsible for all maintenance of the on-site central sewer systems in perpetuity, and the responsibility for maintenance shall not be borne by Fluvanna County or any other public agency.
- 5. The utility systems permitted by the Special Use Permit shall be limited to the development areas shown on the Ballinger Bluffs rural cluster development plans and any expansion of the system will require an amendment to the Special Use Permit.

Waiver to Administer an Existing Split Precinct – Eric Dahl, County Administrator & Joyce Pace, General Registrar

The Code of Virginia, 24.2-307, requires the elimination of split precincts for elections held in November, 2021 and all subsequent elections. Fluvanna has two split House of Delegate precincts, Columbia and Fork Union, and one split State Senate precinct, Cunningham.

Under the provisions of 24.2-307, localities are required to comply with the following:

Each precinct shall be wholly contained within a single congressional district, Senate district, House of Delegates district, and election district used for the election of one or more members of the governing body or school board for the county or city. In each year ending in one, the governing body of each county and city shall establish the precinct boundaries to be consistent with any congressional district, Senate district, House of Delegates district, and local election district that was adopted by the appropriate authority by June 15 of that year. If congressional districts, Senate districts, House of Delegates districts, or local election districts have not been adopted by the appropriate authority by June 15 of a year ending in one, the governing body may use the congressional districts, Senate districts, House of Delegates districts, or local election districts as such districts existed on June 15 of that year as the basis for establishing the precinct boundaries to be used for the elections to be held in November of that year. Such governing body shall establish precinct boundaries to be consistent with any subsequent changes to the congressional districts, Senate districts, House of Delegates districts, or local election districts. If a governing body is unable to establish a precinct with the minimum number of registered voters without splitting the precinct between two or more congressional districts, Senate districts, House of Delegates districts, or local election districts, it shall apply to the State Board for a waiver to administer a split precinct. The State Board may grant the waiver or direct the governing body to establish a precinct with fewer than the minimum number of registered voters as permitted by § 24.2-309. A governing body granted a waiver to administer a split precinct or directed to establish a precinct with fewer than the minimum number of registered voters may use such a precinct for any election held that year.

With the delay in redistricting, it would be beneficial for the Board of Supervisors to give serious consideration to completing the procedures required for requesting the "Waiver to Administer an Existing Split Precinct" application for this November's election.

The Department of Elections requires a copy of the minutes from a Board of Supervisors meeting, in which the governing body formally requests a waiver until such a time as redistricting can be completed.

*Economic Development Projects Update* – Bryan Rothamel, Economic Development Coordinator Silk City Printing

- 93 New Jobs
- \$5.7 Million capital investment
- Governor Northam announced Silk City Printing moving to 60 Carysbrook Road (previous Thomasville Furniture factory) on October 20, 2020 with a \$5.7 million capital investment and hiring 91 employees by 2026.
- Silk City Printing had their first shipment of printed apparel shipped on October 20, 2020 with 20 employees in the facility.
- By Christmas they were up to 40 employees. By the sixth month (April 2021) they were up to 71 employees.
- Anticipation is over 120 employees by summer.
- Apparel printed at the Fork Union facility is shipped to Target, Walmart, Marshalls, etc.
- SCP is continuing to hire entry level positions with a few management positions available.
- SCP also has difficulty with truck drivers locating the facility as there are no signs on Route 15. SCP has requested to place a 2 ft<sup>2</sup> sign at the intersection of Route 15 and Carysbrook Road. This is the county-owned Carysbrook Complex.



#### YAE Wellness

- YAE Wellness provided a letter of intent to purchase 15 acres of the Fork Union Property for a medical cannabis cultivation facility, if awarded the HSA I license. Applications were due in early December 2020.
- HSA I license was projected to be awarded March 2021 by the Board of Pharmacy. The original license holder (MedMen in Staunton) sued the Board of Pharmacy and the case is still in litigation. Next hearing is June 25, 2021.
- YAE Wellness' application is still on hold.
- YAE Wellness launched a new website: www.yaewellness.com.

#### LKQ

#### Approval Timeline:

- I-2 rezoning of TMP 4-A-27A (ZMP 17:04) approved December 20, 2017. This is to the property.
- SUP for salvage and scrap yard (SUP 18:01) approved March 21, 2018. The SUP applicant was developer KP Development (now US Capital Development).
- Sketch plan (SDP 20:03) approved August 11, 2020.
- A final site plan was the next step and never submitted.

#### LKQ Letter:

- US Capital Development alerted the County the contract on the property had a decision to purchase by April 30, 2021. Because LKQ was not moving forward with the project this year, US Capital could not keep the property under contract for another year.
- <u>LKQ sent a letter</u> on May 4 indicating it would no longer pursue SDP 20:03, "Current market conditions render the project infeasible for LKQ".

#### Steps moving forward:

- The property is still zoned I-2. The property owner has reached out to the County to market the property on <u>VA Scan</u>, like other land available for development. <u>It is now listed</u> and will be submitted for new projects when applicable.
- This property had a <u>preliminary study in 2014</u> included possibility for several buildings for a large industrial development.
- The SUP was approved in 2018 and the SDP approved in 2020. The Board of Supervisors can either allow
  the SUP to continue or they have the option to revoke it. Staff's recommendation is to leave the SUP in
  place on the parcel.

State and Local Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Fund - American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) – Eric Dahl, County Administrator

#### Background:

- Congress passed and the President signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021
- Within the ARPA, Congress has allocated approximately \$350 billion to the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds for eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to respond to the COVID-19 emergency and to bring back jobs.
- Recovery funds are targeted to support households, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers, and communities hardest hit by the pandemic crisis.
- Fluvanna County's total allocation is \$5,296,878, with a first payment of \$2,648,439 expected within the month and a second/final payment of \$2,648,439 one year after the first.
- The eligible expenditures period March 3, 2021 December 31, 2024.

#### Objective for use of funds:

- Support for urgent COVID-19 response efforts to continue to decrease spread of the virus and bring the pandemic under control
- Replacement of lost revenue for eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs
- Support for immediate economic stabilization of households and businesses
- Addressing systemic public health and economic challenges that have contributed to the unequal impact
  of the pandemic
- These funds also can be used to make necessary investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

#### Recipients may use these funds to:

- Support public health expenditures to fund COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff
- Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency including economic harm to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector
- Replace lost public sector revenue to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic
- Provide premium pay for essential workers offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and storm water infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet
- 1. Supporting the public health response
- · Vaccination programs
- Medical expenses
- Testing
- Contact tracing
- Isolation or quarantine
- PPE purchases
- Support for vulnerable populations to access medical or public health services
- Public health surveillance (e.g., monitoring for variants)

- Enforcement of public health orders
- Public communication efforts
- Enhancement of healthcare capacity, including alternative care facilities
- Support for prevention, mitigation, or other services in congregate living facilities and schools
- Enhancement of public health data systems
- Capital investments in public facilities to meet pandemic operational needs

 Ventilation improvements in key settings like healthcare facilities

#### 2. Addressing the negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency

- Delivering assistance to workers and families, including aid to unemployed workers and job training, as well as aid to households facing food, housing, or other financial insecurity. In addition, these funds can support survivor's benefits for family members of COVID-19 victims.
- Supporting small businesses, helping them to address financial challenges caused by the pandemic and
  to make investments in COVID-19 prevention and mitigation tactics, as well as to provide technical
  assistance. To achieve these goals, recipients may employ this funding to execute a broad array of loan,
  grant, in-kind assistance, and counseling programs to enable small businesses to rebound from the
  downturn.
- Speeding the recovery of the tourism, travel, and hospitality sectors, supporting industries that were particularly hard-hit by the COVID-19 emergency and are just now beginning to mend. Similarly impacted sectors within a local area are also eligible for support.
- Rebuilding public sector capacity, by rehiring public sector staff and replenishing unemployment insurance (UI) trust funds, in each case up to pre-pandemic levels. Recipients may also use this funding to build their internal capacity to successfully implement economic relief programs, with investments in data analysis, targeted outreach, technology infrastructure, and impact evaluations.

#### 3. Serving the hardest-hit communities and families

- Addressing health disparities and the social determinants of health, through funding for community health workers, public benefits navigators, remediation of lead hazards, and community violence intervention programs;
- Investments in housing and neighborhoods, such as services to address individuals experiencing homelessness, affordable housing development, housing vouchers, and residential counseling and housing navigation assistance to facilitate moves to neighborhoods with high economic opportunity;
- Addressing educational disparities through new or expanded early learning services, providing additional resources to high-poverty school districts, and offering educational services like tutoring or afterschool programs as well as services to address social, emotional, and mental health needs; and,
- Promoting healthy childhood environments, including new or expanded high quality childcare, home
  visiting programs for families with young children, and enhanced services for child welfare-involved
  families and foster youth.

#### 4. Replacing lost public sector revenue

- State, local, territorial, and Tribal governments that are facing budget shortfalls may use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to avoid cuts to government services and staffing.
- With these additional resources, recipients can continue to provide valuable public services and ensure that fiscal austerity measures do not hamper the broader economic recovery.
- Recipients may use these funds to replace lost revenue. Treasury's Interim Final Rule establishes a methodology that each recipient can use to calculate its reduction in revenue.
  - Analysis of this expected trend begins with the last full fiscal year prior to the public health emergency and projects forward at either (a) the recipient's average annual revenue growth over the three full fiscal years prior to the public health emergency or (b) 4.1%, the national average state and local revenue growth rate from 2015-18 (the latest available data).

#### 5. Providing premium pay for essential workers

- Recipients may use this funding to provide premium pay directly, or through grants to private employers, to a broad range of essential workers who must be physically present at their jobs including, among others:
  - Staff at nursing homes, hospitals, and home-care settings
  - Workers at farms, food production facilities, grocery stores, and restaurants
  - Janitors and sanitation workers
  - Public health and safety staff
  - Truck drivers, transit staff, and warehouse workers
  - Childcare workers, educators, and school staff
  - Social service and human services staff

6. Investing in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure

- Recipients may use this funding to invest in an array of drinking water infrastructure projects, such as building or upgrading facilities and transmission, distribution, and storage systems, including the replacement of lead service lines.
- Recipients may also use this funding to invest in wastewater infrastructure projects, including
  constructing publicly-owned treatment infrastructure, managing and treating stormwater or subsurface
  drainage water, facilitating water reuse, and securing publicly-owned treatment works.
- Recognizing the acute need in certain communities, Treasury's Interim Final Rule provides that
  investments in broadband be made in areas that are currently unserved or underserved—in other
  words, lacking a wireline connection that reliably delivers minimum speeds of 25 Mbps download and 3
  Mbps upload. Recipients are also encouraged to prioritize projects that achieve last-mile connections to
  households and businesses.

#### **Ineligible Uses**

- States and territories may not use this funding to directly or indirectly offset a reduction in net tax revenue due to a change in law from March 3, 2021 through the last day of the fiscal year in which the funds provided have been spent.
- No recipient may use this funding to make a deposit to a pension fund.
- Treasury's Interim Final Rule identifies several other ineligible uses, including funding debt service, legal settlements or judgments, and deposits to rainy day funds or financial reserves.
- Further, general infrastructure spending is not covered as an eligible use outside of water, sewer, and broadband investments or above the amount allocated under the revenue loss provision.
