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
Fluvanna County Department of Social Services Mission:

Referral received via state hotline or direct contact to agency.


Fluvanna **CPS** received 438 referrals in 2023

FLUVANNA CPS CONDUCTED 90 FAMILY ASSESSMENTS & INVESTIGATIONS IN 2023

*Parent/guardian must attend a mandatory family partnership meeting. Family Services Worker can recommend an FPM when needed in a case, at the change of placement, and before court hearing.

*Parent/guardian and children must have monthly face-to-face visit with Family Services Worker.

*Family Services Worker to conduct monthly home visits, primarily done in the family home.

*Parent/guardian must participate in monthly Child and Family Team Meeting with Family Service Workers and any service providers.

*Family Services Workers renew the Service Plan, Safety Assessment and Risk Assessment every three month. Close and services needed.

Open a family support case, an in-home case, or foster care placement. These cases typically are open 6 months to one year and may need CSA funding.

Close, with no services needed.

If Court Action is needing the Parent/Guardian must attend the following hearings:

*Preliminary hearing within 5 days of petitions being filed.

*Adjudicatory hearing within 30 days of petitions being filed.

*Dispositional hearing within 90 days of petitions being filed.

*Foster Care Review hearing every 90 days.

Fluvanna CPS averages 18 In-Home or Family Support Cases a month and conducted 433 mandated face-to-face contacts with families.

VPSA SCHOOL FINANCING REFUNDING BONDS

VPSA School Financing Refunding Bonds

- The Virginia Public School Authority (VPSA) has announced that it is considering the refunding ("refinancing") of its 2014C Pool bonds this spring, as market conditions are favorable.
- There is an opportunity for Fluvanna to take part and do a streamlined refunding of the Middle School bonds that were issued in 2014.
- The savings from this potential refunding will be passed along as an annual credit to the locality and the other applicable local borrowers.
- Please note that savings amounts are subject to market conditions and can change up until the sale date
 of the VPSA Refunding Bonds.
- If Fluvanna does not want to VPSA to consider refunding bonds, we have to let them know by tomorrow, Thursday, April 4th.
- Fluvanna has consulted with its Bond Counsel, Haneburg and Hurlbert, and this will be a favorable outcome for the County.

VPSA School Financing Refunding Bonds

Some important dates:

- April 4, 2024 Certificate of Refunding of the Local School Bonds due to VPSA
 - The refunding opportunity does not require official action by the BOS or School Board
- April 23, 2024 Tentative date of the pricing of the VPSA Refunding Bonds. We will be provided with more information on the refunding credits within a few days thereafter, including the amount of your annual savings.
- May 14, 2024 Tentative closing of the VPSA Refunding Bonds

Savings:

- FY25 estimated debt service savings annually ~\$3K
- FY26-FY33 estimated debt service savings annually ~\$20K
- The potential savings to Fluvanna County is ~\$105K.

^{*}The only reason not do participate is if the BOS wanted to pay off this debt sooner. Once the refunding occurs, the bonds will no longer be callable ("pre-paid in full").

CVEC BROADBAND LOCAL TAXES GRANT

Background

- Central Virginia Electric Cooperative (CVEC) approached the County in late 2017 on an aggressive broadband access plan to provide options to its 36,000 members in Central Virginia. Fluvanna County leaders supported the project early on for approximately 8,900 Fluvanna households to have access to broadband within the CVEC distribution system.
- The Economic Development Authority of Fluvanna County, with support from the Fluvanna County Board of Supervisors, approved an agreement for grant payments with CVEC and Central Virginia Services, Inc. (CVSI).


Agreement – Qualification of Schedule and Employment of Workers within the County

 Under Qualifications of schedule, it described work is deemed complete when service is available to qualifying customers within each service area, discusses qualifying boundaries and provisions for time extensions on account of delays for weather and other causes.

 Employment of workers within County, it described in the agreement that CVEC would establish not fewer than 10 permanent, full-time jobs in the county.

Agreement - Priority of Work

- 1. Zions Dec 31, 2019
- 2. Hensons Store Dec 31, 2020
- 3. Another Area (Kidds Store) Mar 31, 2022 (with limited broadband service)
- 1. Cunningham Mar 31, 2023
- 2. Remainder of County by Dec 31, 2024



Final EDA Agreement Details (Approved July 23, 2018)

- A. ZXR Substation (South of I-64) Completed by Dec 31, 2019
- B. Hensons Store Substation (South of I-64) Completed by Dec 31, 2020
- C. Another Substation (Kidds Store) Completed by Mar 31, 2022
- D. Cunningham Substation Completed by Mar 31, 2023
- E. Remainder of County estimated to be completed, but not guaranteed, NLT Dec 31, 2024
- F. Cash contribution when 1st Substation Completed \$375K
- G. Local Taxes Grant based on new Construction Costs Not to exceed \$500K
- H. At least 10 new jobs created in Fluvanna County, such jobs to be filled not later than December 31, 2024. The positions, or similar jobs, will be maintained for five years from when they are created.

CVEC Broadband Local Taxes Grant

The below explanations are provided by Gary Wood from CVEC/CVSI/Firefly:

- You will note that the timeline for actual completion did not line up exactly with the agreement Priority of Works dates. There are several reasons for Zion and Hensons being slightly behind their dates.
- Zion was slowed due to weather issues along with some material supply issues in 2019. The work for the circuits feeding into Fluvanna west and south were completed first in January 2020, given the priority noted in the agreement. The eastern circuit was delayed slightly due to redesign to include the Henson Store circuit coming down Rt. 15, bringing more Fluvanna homes online earlier.

CVEC Broadband Local Taxes Grant

 When a VATI grant became possible for Columbia and the Cunningham circuit east of Rt. 15, this area with more low and moderate income households was bumped up in priority which pushed the remaining Henson Store station back a bit. COVID impacts on labor availability and supply chain issues slowed the construction of Henson Store and Kidds Store as well.

• Firefly worked through those issues and sped up construction to complete the entire build in 2022 instead of 2024. We also have exceeded the number of full-time positions, with more than 20 full-time positions in Fluvanna County before the end of 2024.

CVEC Broadband Local Taxes Grant

- The agreement allows for some relaxation of the completion dates due to weather as well as unforeseen and uncontrollable causes.
 We would ask that the county consider the impacts of the weather, supply chain issues and COVID, and also take into account the overall project acceleration that completed the entire county two years ahead of time.
- We would ask that the county consider these timing factors in accepting our work as meeting the spirit of the agreement.

CREATION OF SOLAR COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO THE COUNTY CODE FOR SMALL SCALE, MINOR SCALE AND UTILITY SCALE SOLAR GENERATION FACILITIES

Resolution of Intention to Remove Utility Scale Solar in A-1

 At the Board of Supervisor's meeting on March 6, the Board approved a resolution of intention to amend § 22-4-2.2 to remove utility scale solar generation facilities as a use allowed by special use permit in the Agricultural, A-1 Zoning District.

Timeline for Sending Ordinance to the Board

 On March 20, 2024, the Board approved a timeline of 90 days for the Planning Commission to hold a public hearing and send a recommendation to the Board.

Approved motion:

 I move the Board of Supervisors request that the Planning Commission make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors within 90 days on the ordinance to amend § 22-4-2.2 of the County Code to remove utility scale solar generation facilities as a use allowed by special use permit in the Agricultural, A-1 Zoning District.

Resolution of Intention to Add Supplemental Regulations

 At the Board of Supervisor's meeting on March 6, the Board approved a resolution of intention to enact § 22-17-21 to add supplemental regulations for small scale solar generation facilities, minor scale solar generation facilities and utility scale solar generation facilities.

Timeline for Considering Supplemental Regulations

 On March 20, 2024, the Board approved a timeline of 180 days for the Planning Commission to hold a public hearing and send a recommendation to the Board.

Approved Motion:

 I move the Board of Supervisors request that the Planning Commission make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors within 180 days on the ordinance to enact § 22-17-21 to add supplemental regulations for small scale solar generation facilities, minor scale solar generation facilities and utility scale solar generation facilities.

Creation of Solar Committee

- The Planning Commission discussed the two Board resolutions to amend the County Code at its meeting on March 12, 2024.
- The Planning Commission suggested that the Board create a solar committee that could consist of two Board members and two Planning Commission members.
- The Solar Committee would consider the amendments to the County Code and provide suggested language for the consideration by the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors.

Legal Considerations Regarding the Committee

- The Board of Supervisors may appoint such advisory boards, committees and commissions as it may deem necessary pursuant to Virginia Code Section 15.2-1411.
- Committees of a public body, whether performing functions delegated by the public body or acting in a purely advisory capacity, are subject to the Freedom of Information Act, usually in the same manner as the public body itself (Va. Code § 2.2-3701).
- Committees appointed by a local governing body do not have to keep minutes unless their membership includes a majority of the members of the governing body (Va. Code § 2.2-3707(I)(iv)).
