## How does it work?

- 1. February 24-6:30 PM Receive directions about sample collection and a pick up sample kit.
- 2. February 26- Between 7:00 AM- 10:00 AM Collect samples and drop off at Fluvanna Community Center. Samples are sent to Virginia Tech for analysis.
- 3. March 25- 6:30 PM- Receive your confidential results, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing any problems or concerns.
