Dear Bremono Power Station Neighbor-

I am reaching out to you today to provide an update on the demolition work currently taking place at Dominion Energy's retired Bremono Power Station. This demolition work is not part of the coal ash project and will have no impact on the coal ash project at Bremono Power Station.

In 2019, Dominion Energy announced it would retire Bremono Power Station. Physical demolition activities began in late 2021 and are expected to be completed in late 2022. Activities that have been completed thus far include the removal of much of the station interior and much of the station exterior.

The controlled demolition of Bremono Power Station Units 3 and 4 and smokestacks will take place the morning of Friday, September 23, 2022 at approximately 10:00AM, with sirens activated before to alert those in the immediate area. Bremono Road will be closed starting at 9:15AM between the Bremono Post Office and 1268 Bremono Road. The James River will also be closed between the Bremono Bluff Boat Launch and approximately 1/2 mile downstream.

The station is expected to collapse in less than 10 seconds after the demolition charge. Once the controlled demolition is complete, crews will move in to survey the area to ensure that it is safe. After the "All Clear," cleanup and the reopening of Bremono Road and the James River will begin. It is anticipated this will be completed by 11:00AM.

Before Friday, September 23, 2022, residents within 1200' of the station site boundary will be contacted by Jackson Demolition.

In the case of unfavorable weather on Friday, September 23, the controlled demolition may be moved to the morning of Saturday, September 24.
