CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Watson called the meeting of the James River Water Authority (JRWA) Board of Directors to order at 9:00 a.m. and led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Mr. Dahl requested that a bill from MBP for \$1,529.55 be considered for payment on this agenda; the bill had been received prior to the creation of the Board packet but was inadvertently excluded from the packet. On the motion of Mr. Chesser, seconded by Mr. Anderson, the agenda was adopted, as amended, on a vote of 4-0.

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC

(none)

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PRECEDING MEETING

On the motion of Mr. Dahl, seconded by Mr. Anderson, which carried by a vote of 4-0, the Board approved the meeting minutes.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Mr. Chesser briefed the Board on the bills put forward for consideration. On the motion of Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mr. Dahl, the bills, to include the bill from MBP, were approved by a vote of 4-0.

PUBLIC INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION

Discussion – Project Status Update

Mr. Joe Modica, of MBP, provided an update on the Joint Permit Application (JPA) and Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) noting that the JPA and MOA has been submitted; the Army Corps has assigned a reviewer who is in dialogue with Timmons Group to gather additional information. Regarding the JPA, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has requested and received additional information from Timmons; now awaiting a response from DEQ. Mr. Modica noted that cultural resources items are on track. The Section 106 MOA, Phase II

report, and Phase III treatment plan (TP) have been provided to the Monacans and the Department of Historic Resources and are under review. Once approval for TP is secured, the JRWA can solicit for Phase III Treatment Plan services.

Mr. Justin Curtis with AquaLaw emphasized that there are parts of this process we can control and parts we can't: we have no control over the time it takes an agency to review, and we are responding to the agencies as necessary to keep the process moving forward.

Mr. Modica indicated that the Rose property plat should be completed in the next day or two. He noted that the schedule of values and pricing to 100% should be available by April 21.

Mr. Dahl reiterated that in order to move forward with the property acquisition for the pump station site and associated easements on the Rose property, a current plat is required. Once the plat is finalized Mr. Dahl will approach the Rose's to finalize property acquisition.

Mr. Saunders, Timmons Group, reported a favorable meeting with Virginia Department of Health reintroducing the project and providing plans and specifications to request VDH approval in not too distant future. Mr. Saunders reminded the Board that it's time to make an initial inquiry of Dominion Energy regarding electrical service to the pump station; Mr. Dahl noted that he would make that inquiry.

Mr. Dahl provided a brief update on the creation of a cash flow model, noting that it's not ready to bring forward to the Board as data is continuing to be gathered. Mr. Dahl reminded the Board that debt proceeds continue to be used to cover project costs, with approximately \$4.1 million of the original approximately \$9.5 million, remaining. The project team has been asked to project 6-10 months of anticipated expenditures in order to create the cash flow model and determine when those debt proceeds will be expended. It is anticipated that proceeds should last through the end of the year but there are large items that are on the horizon. Mr. Dahl noted before those proceeds are fully expended, the counties and Authority will need to have a funding plan in place. Mr. Watson asked if any of the funds spent on the prior pump station site are recoupable; Mr. Dahl did not think so.

Mr. Anderson inquired about cash needed for property acquisition and if earnest money may be required for long lead-time items. Mr. Dahl asked Timmons about the anticipated timeline for a preliminary plan; Mr. Saunders noted that the current 15% level plan has been expanded to include greater definition on the scope of work, the amount of pipe that will be needed, as well as other long-lead items in order to reduce risk of price escalation. Mr. Saunders anticipates that Faulconer Construction will generate a summary of items and associated quotes, and a timeline of when materials will be needed, prioritizing critical path items. Mr. Dahl noted that the current cash flow model does not include materials, but does include cultural resources items, consultants' fees, and current and proposed change orders. Mr. Dahl anticipates a more refined cash flow model will be available at the next Board meeting.
